BOXTED GOES DIGITAL

A Colchester Borough Council digital service access point was installed at the Boxted Community Hub on Friday 3 March 2017.

It allows the residents of Boxted to access a range of online services for Colchester Borough Council, as well as Essex County Council and Essex Police.

These services include applying for housing, accessing Benefits and Council Tax services, reporting a missed bin collection and applying for a Blue Badge.

The digital access point also features a dedicated Police button providing users with access to a range of information, advice and other services. Customers who press the button can link to the Essex Police website to report a non-emergency crime, including fly-tipping, or lost and found items, as well as to get advice, find out about their community police team and even join the police.

LANGHAM W.I.

Our March meeting was a bittersweet occasion. Lynn Mortimer the journalist gave one of our best talks ever, touching on a wide range of topics and hitting the spot with quirky speculations about the male of the species. She had the whole room, packed with over 30 members, laughing!

The Langham WI was then 'suspended' during a short ceremony by officials from the county, after they had taken a poll of members. Though our meetings end, this means our remaining money is held for three years for the use of anyone setting up a new WI in this village. We marked the occasion with one last party, splashing out on fizzy drinks. There were speeches of thanks and reminiscences before we sang Jerusalem by candlelight, to remember the ladies who started the group in 1938, and those who have kept it going over the years. Jean Reynolds played the piano.

As President, I would like to say how sad we were to reach the end of the line. The WI has been a great centre of friendship and activities, not to mention support, for the women of the village for a very long time. We intend continuing our support for the Hospice and Help for Heroes, and hope to arrange a few outings.

BOXTED HISTORY GROUP

February's talk was on the History of the Essex County Hospital by Dr Fabrizio Casale, who worked there for many years and is a member of the Colchester Medical Society.

During the Napoleonic War a military garrison in the town meant the hospital mainly treating wounded soldiers. In peacetime the Rev. Joseph Jefferson established a voluntary hospital for civilians, relying on donations to fund treatments. Consequently a patient had to be recommended for admittance by a donating subscriber and have a reasonable chance of recovery.

In 1820 the first patient was admitted to the first phase of the present hospital, then to commemorate Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee, a nurses' home and children's ward were added.

During WW1 women and children were moved out and the hospital reverted to military use.

In 1920 the Courtauld family paid off the hospital's debts and the Red Cross funded the building of casualty and outpatient departments and a Private ward, appropriately named after Rev. Jefferson.

In 1960s new Radiotherapy and Outpatients were added, bringing the number of wards up to eight.

As far as the staff were concerned the Hospital Arms pub opposite affectionately became known as Ward 9. As we all know Essex County's life as a hospital is now drawing to a close but what does the future hold?

Spotlight On...Hornestreet Field Conservation Area

A Hidden Gem of Langham

This 1.5acre site was purchased in 1999 by a group of 10 Langham Parishioners wishing to preserve the character of the north side of School Road, behind The Oaks School.

The site is held in trust by three trustees and managed by two site managers. The trustees are currently looking into the future maintenance, upkeep and maybe expansion of the Conservation Area, with preliminary talks being held with Langham Parish Council to discuss options.

Previously an orchard and an arable field, Hornestreet Field has been transformed over the last 19 years into a tranquil conservation area – a marvellous asset to the village. Both The Stour Valley Project and The Dedham Vale Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty have been key in the development of the site, giving advice, practical help and grants to the trust.

You'll find a pond, an orchard, a wildflower meadow as well as wildlife habitats. Mown paths make it easy for you to wander round the site. A focus of planting now is plants which will help to encourage bees and other pollinators.

The first trees put onto the site were Common Oaks, planted by children from Langham Primary School in February 2001. Since then many more species have been planted, about a third of these as a result of adoption by local residents. All the trees are numbered and can be identified from the list on the noticeboard. There are still some trees available for adoption at a cost of £40 per tree.

Everyone is welcome to visit and enjoy the variety of wildlife and plants, provided they understand and respect the intention to maintain the site as an area for conservation. Access is via two footpaths, one from School Road next to The Oaks and the other is in Greyhound Hill.

Dogs may be walked on the site as long as they are kept on a lead – this is very important because if allowed to run free they can disturb the wildlife.

If visiting the site please ensure you take away any litter or dog poo as there are no facilities for disposing of them on site and it's important to leave this conservation area pristine for the wildlife.

The site is used to learn about nature by the Primary School, Pre-school group, Scouts, a University college and local people, as well as those who walk the public footpath through it.

SHOEBOX APPEAL



On Sunday 19 February, Chris Roberts, Assistant Director of Operation Christmas Child, came to St Mary's church, Langham to talk about the shoeboxes and the process involved between the shoeboxes we pack and the delivery to the child.

The Appeal covers 160 countries worldwide. From checking and packing at the warehouse, the box will transport to a designated child where a community has signed up to receive them. That is not to say those who do not sign up, but would like a box can still receive them.

As a Christian organisation, the information on Christianity is only offered to each child with their parents and community leaders consent but the child will still receive a box even if that consent is not forthcoming.

Despite scepticism expressed through the media, the Appeal is renowned throughout the world helping, over the last 26 years, 145 million children living desperate lives, experience moments of joy and happiness opening their shoebox.

Chris told of experiences of gifts received which were absolutely remarkable and as far as they know not one child or child's family from countries where the boxes are distributed have ever made a complaint regarding the methods Samaritans Purse use.
