So, he sent Jesus to do it for us, because the baby in Mary's arms is God, hearing our hidden fears and tears, and coming in person to save us and set us free. So let's celebrate and enjoy Christmas and say, thank-you to God for making this possible through a little baby.

### ARMISTICE COMMEMORATION AT LANGHAM

The day began with a march to the War Memorial School Gate (appropriately decorated by the primary schoolchildren) by 2<sup>nd</sup> Langham Scout Group and a Service of Remembrance led by Lay Minister Denise Hobday. The gathering was swelled by a group of passing cyclists who stayed for the service. Wreaths were later laid at the USAAF Monument.

In the afternoon at the Community Centre, there was a display of Great War and village memorabilia, "poppy stones" (Langham Scouts) and writings from the period of the Great War from the schoolchildren. The concluding parts of the BBC's 1964 *The Great War were* screened, while refreshments (including "Centenary Bake Off "biscuits) were served by Langham Ladies. Patsy Ann Maggs and Angela McLauchlan read from the memoirs of their father and grandfather respectively.

The commemoration concluded, as in over 1,000 towns and villages in this country and overseas, with the Last Post sounded at 6.55 pm, followed by the lighting of the newlyerected Beacon of Light and a peal of bells at St Mary's Church, the sound being ingeniously relayed to the assembly.

The Parish Council expresses the gratitude of the village to Bob and Liz Schofield for their huge contribution to the acquisition of the Beacon of Light, which was made and erected by Messrs Brewer of Lawford (who also kindly provided and manned the 'cherry-picker' for loading and lighting). The robust post is of local English oak and the beacon will now be a permanent feature of the Recreation Ground. The Council is also grateful to all those who organised or contributed to this significant village event, and especially Edward Hobday, who memorably sounded the bugle for Last Post and Reveille in the morning and Last Post in the evening.


