

Rev John Robinson entertained us with his melodies and memories of the 50s at a later meeting. Much laughter was to be heard when we

were entertained by our own Boxted Buskers at the Strawberry tea.

Langham Heritage Group A Haunting Story

Often an afternoon's Bridge turns more to chatter than cards. One afternoon a friend from Dedham told us that, before they moved there, her young family used to stay in a house in Langham – and that it was haunted! Broomhouse, dating from the 15th century, is down by the river behind Langham Hall and a short walk from Stratford St. Mary. The family loved living there. They hired ponies for their daughter and friend who, with the farmers permission, were free to ride in the fields all around. Her son would take their dinghy, made by his father, up the Stour to look for monsters; he and a friend would spend all day hunting and only came home when hungry. On leaving after their first visit my friend suggested the children wave goodbye to the old house. They replied "There's a woman standing in the window waving back." My friend said the hair stood up on the back of her neck! The family got quite friendly with Emma. Apparently she loved children but died in childbirth and was buried in Langham Churchyard. So when anyone was in the house with young children or babies she was there. Emma was a Victorian ghost and, as my friend removed the Victorian fireplaces to expose the original Tudor hearths, Emma gradually faded and she no longer haunts the house.

Simon Gallup adds to the story: Emma Chisnall, born Emma Bird in Stoke by Nayland was buried on 17th December, 1882. Harry Chisnall, aged 2 months, was buried a fortnight after his mother. Emma's husband William, a farm labourer, is recorded as living at Ewens Farm in 1891 - a widower.
