PCC UPDATE

The PCC has agree to give a short summary of its meetings so that what it is considering and deciding is generally known.

The PCC met on 11th March. The finances of the parish were considered in the light of the need to be financially self-supporting as a parish, and as part of our MMU, The North Colchester Family of Churches, by 2025 when the national church will not be subsidising this Diocese. This is because MMUs which do not cover the costs of their stipendiary clergy will not be given another one when the current one moves. This parish covers its share of the costs at present, but we need to keep an eye on this as our expenditure is greater than our income.

It was agreed that Stephen Pollington would succeed Tim Clarke as editor of the Newsletter. Paul Armstrong will care for the advertisements. Thank-you very much both of you.

A new list of those who can Administer the Elements, the bread and the wine, in Eucharistic services, was agreed. When the current situation changes they will be offered training and they will be formally welcomed in church.

Safeguarding: the Parish Activity plans and risk assessments were presented and approved.

The PCC has worked hard to produce a Priorities and Strategy document which will guide the life and development of the parish in the coming five years. It will be circulated before the Annual Parochial Church Meeting, so that it can be discussed there.

Dominic Sheil and Denise Hobday have agreed to continue to represent the parish on the Deanery Synod. Stephen Garner will be standing down.

KEEPING BOXTED LITTER FREE!

In 2008 the St Peter's Church community initiated a volunteer group from the village to address the then huge problem of litter along our village roads. Since then the group has grown to more than 25 active volunteers. Although we cannot yet claim that our roads are litter free the group has made a real difference. It is not a glamorous activity and the group deserve a big 'thank you' for their efforts, persistence and achievements. If you see them out and about with their litter pickers give them a toot to show your appreciation!

Members of the group take on a designated stretch of road and aim to walk it once a month. Whilst the group are able to walk more than 80 per cent of our roads on this basis we are looking for a handful of additional volunteers so that we can cover all the village roads. If any resident notices a vehicle fly tipping to try and take a note of the details of the vehicle and report this to CBC. Our villages are now becoming very vulnerable to this sort of thing, being the first areas of countryside north of the town.

BOXTED HISTORY GROUP

Greyfriars is a very well known building in Colchester which was the subject of February's talk hosted by Alan Skinner, the last principal of the Adult Learning Centre located there. Alan was well researched on the history of the site which is now a fraction of its original size in Roman times. A group of Franciscan Monks settled on the site around 1226 but the large friary wasn't completed until 300 years later. With the dissolution of the monasteries the friary was demolished and the site broken up and used for many things over the centuries from a secure area for holding prisoners after the Siege of Colchester to a **Botanical Garden.**

A series of grand houses were built in the Georgian period and in 1904 the last private owner, Dr Fenn, sold the property to create a Convent school and evolved into what we see today. In 1923 the Council brought the site for the Lower School for Boys which in turn became the Adult Learning Centre for the next 40 years. Now its been symphatically restored and opened again as a Hotel.
