Langham Parish Council Report – October 2020

angham Parish Council has continued to keep busy within the village, endeavouring to keep our village somewhere to be proud of during these difficult and unexpected times.

The Parish Council has been forced to change the way it operates due to legislation but continues to hold its monthly meetings remotely, so business has pretty much been as normal.

One Councillor unfortunately resigned, for personal reasons, Andrew Stacey had been on the Council for many years, so many thanks must go to him for all the time and energy he gave towards the Council and the village of Langham.

This does mean we are a councillor down and following leads to find a replacement for him, not as easy as previously as we cannot just meet an individual for a cup of tea and a chat.

he Recreation Ground has been looked after, the field was kept trimmed, so whenever activities could resume, it was all set to go, which fortunately has happened and the footballers are playing at the weekends again. During the time when the play area was locked up, repairs and servicing to the equipment and surfaces were carried out.

The hedge behind the Pavilion was trimmed to tidy it up. This was fortunately carried out in time for Merchant Navy day. As the hedge had been trimmed, the Red Ensign did not snag on the brambles. A short service

was carried out for this event and the Ensign was flown on the freshly painted flag pole.

A litter-pick was arranged for one Saturday afternoon. Ten volunteers assembled at the Community Centre car park, collected



bags and pickers before heading off to all corners of the village for a 2 hour pick. Six large sacks of rubbish were collected: well done to all involved.

By chance on the Monday following, the Highways department were replacing the sign for Moor Road, on the corner of Moor Road and School Road, (the original Moor Road sign had mysteriously disappeared at some point). These gentlemen were also responsible for emptying the rubbish bins around the village, so they took all the rubbish we had collected and gave us a roll of bags, so further litter picks can take place.

ne big event that did take place just after the summer holidays was the replacement of the Pre-School outdoor area floor. The original floor had fallen into a less than perfect state that not only looked unsightly but was also becoming a trip hazard for the staff and children. The Parish Council managed to secure funding for this from the company (NextEnergy Capital) that owns the Solar Farm off Park Lane. This certainly is a great visual improvement to the Pre-School.

There are other projects that need to be carried out around the village as maintaining Langham is a constant and ongoing task.

Boxted Parish Council Report – October 2020

oxted Parish Council meets 10 times a year as a full Council on the second Wednesday evening of the month August or December). Members of the public are very much welcome to join us on these meetings, just email the Clerk on boxtedparishcouncil@gmail.com for a link to click and you can join us on your computer, tablet or phone. There is a regular slot at the start of each meeting for people to raise any issues which, if they can't be answered straight away, Council can take them away and respond afterwards. The minutes of each meeting are published on the Parish website Council (boxtedparishcouncil.org.uk).

We have one **vacancy** on the Council, if you are interested in stepping forward please contact the Clerk.

Last year we tried to get to every residence in Boxted, a **Housing Needs Survey.** The aim of the survey was to identify what need there was in the village for lower cost housing for local people as well as to understand what support there was for an affordable



housing scheme

for Boxted-connected people. We received a good response, and the Rural Community Council for Essex (RCCE) was able to analyse the results and confirm that Boxted has a need for affordable rented housing units (one 1-bed unit, three 2-bed units and two 3-beds) which is a recommended need of up to 6 units. In addition to this, there was a recommendation for 1 property of affordable sale model of shared ownership. The Council, working with Colchester Borough Council and RCCE, will try to identify a suitable site and look to see how this need can he met

n the last report we said that we were very concerned that Essex Highways intend to replace the steel girder bridge near Boxted Mill, known as Boxted Bridge, which was built in 1901 and sits in the Dedham AONB. Council Τt was consensus that this would be bad for the village firstly, because it is the very option that Essex Highways own advisors recommended not taking forward, but more

importantly, the bridge represents part of our village heritage and it real shame would be a completely replace it with something new. We asked Essex Highways to reconsider but we haven't been successful, yet. Our MP, Sir Bernard Jenkin, is involved and we have also succeeded in getting the bridge on Colchester's Local List which recognises building or items of historic or heritage importance. We continue to call into question ECC's decision, especially as it's the dearest option and involves the most disruption. Hopefully we can get ECC to reconsider and go for a more sympathetic outcome.

The **Hub café** is still closed to the public but the take-away service and delivered "meals on wheels" service helping those people shielding in the village are still available. Just phone Bonny on 01206 272129 and she can sort a meal out for you and your family. We have looked to see if a normal (whatever that means) café service could resume and Bonny was hoping to open again but given that Essex has moved to Tier 2 in COVID areas, the future is uncertain again.

We have advertised for a **part time grounds person.** When employed, we will be able to tend to the myriad of small jobs and also concentrate on improving the look of things by keeping the weeds

down and giving things a lick of paint. We have also applied for funding, which if the bid is successful, would help us fund some outdoor gym equipment – keeping our fingers crossed.

ootball and Cricket are back. Our teams are practicing and playing matches which is great to see. The changing facilities aren't available, and whilst the Hub café is closed, the teams are having to be much more self-reliant.

The **Village Hall** is open for bookings as a Covid secure building. We require users to undertake a risk assessment and clean surfaces before any meeting, follow a one way in and one way out system, use the hand sanitiser provided, set the rooms up Covid secure way distancing), wear masks, take track and trace details, and clean hard surfaces before leaving. The hall can't be used for social gatherings, so we are not taking party bookings. If you are interested in booking the Hall for meetings etc call Community Halls in Partnership on 01206 870266.

Don't forget our four newly installed **bike** racks on the Hall front wall; it would be great to see these used – remember to bring your own chain.

WALKING ON

HOT COALS

obody entering Langham Church can fail to see the Millennium Stone set in the floor not far from the doorway. But not everybody will notice

under the organ gallery a cast iron plate inscribed "Mitchell's Patent Reverbrating [sic] Smoke Consuming Hypocaust for warming Churches". Few will have pondered on the long patch of cement, partly covered by carpet, in the nave and fewer still will have noted on the outside of the building an angled quoin at

the junction of the nave west wall and the tower north wall. These are the more visible indications of an unusual hypocaust heating system installed in the church in 1861-3 and probably abandoned in 1879, when there was a major fire in the tower, perhaps caused by the system.

The hypocaust in Langham Church was one of some twenty-five built, almost all in the Midlands, in the middle of the 19th century. It comprised four or five coke-fuelled fire-pits below the floor from which the hot gases warmed the church as they passed through under-floor flues to a chimney rising through the corner of the tower. In the chimney, a small furnace induced an up-draught to ensure the hot gases vented to the atmosphere. The cast iron fire-pit cover plates would undoubtedly have become so hot that treading on them would be best avoided. The system's installation coincided with the building of a gas works by the river at

Dedham, with its by-product of coke, which could have been brought to the church by horse and cart, either directly from Dedham or from the river at Stratford.

he Millennium Stone marks the former site of a fire-pit and its cover plate. The cover plate under the gallery is the sole survivor of the four or five. The

cement patching in the nave dates from the 1950s and is believed to be where flues and a firepit had collapsed. The angled quoin (4) masks the outer face of the chimney. More remnants of the system were exposed between 1997 and 2000, when the west

end of the church was re-ordered, but were unavoidably obliterated..

Research by the Heritage Group of the Chartered Institution of Building Services Engineers has revealed three names of builders or designers of 19th century church hypocaust systems: Bradshaw, Hodson and Mitchell, all bricklayers of Learnington, Warwickshire. But only Hodson has been identified with any certainty and no patents have been traced to Mitchell. How the systems came to be generated in Learnington and nowhere else and how one came to be built in far-away Langham remain unsolved mysteries.
