ou may be reading this article around Eastertime, or a little later. It's at Easter that Christians the world over celebrate Jesus's death and resurrection, and are reminded of God's free gift of forgiveness and love. In the Bible we read, "Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not

proud. It does not dishonour others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not

delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails." (1 *Corinthians* 13:4-8).

Love is the defining characteristic of God's presence, and should be the defining characteristic of ourselves too. But however hard we try to live up to these words - being patient, kind, not envious or proud, always protecting, trusting, hoping and persevering - we will fail in some way or other. But God's love never fails. And it's an unconditional love that is present both in this world and in the next. God loves us so much that He sent Jesus to live among us, and it was when Jesus gave His life for each one of us - for everyone in the world, that He was able to make us right with God.

hen something happens that shakes our lives, when we experience personal difficulties, or when something like the pandemic impacts the world, we can experience many mixed emotions – sorrow, anger, confusion, and

perhaps feelings of despair and hopelessness. The week before Jesus was arrested and crucified, He ensured that He spent time with His

disciples to reassure them about His love, and what would happen after He died. He said to them, "Do not let your hearts be troubled." (John 14:1). And as we look around us there are signs of hope – daffodils are flowering, buds are appearing on trees, we are travelling along the Government Roadmap to a time when we will be able to meet up again, and the Covid vaccine is being rolled out in great numbers.

My prayer is that we are not troubled, anxious, or afraid, but that we know how much God loves us, and we experience hope and peace.

Boxted Parish Council Report – February / March 2021

oxted Parish Council meets 10 times a year as a full Council on the second Wednesday evening of the month (not August or December). Members of the public are very much welcome to join us on these meetings, just email the Clerk on

for a link to click and you can join us on your computer, tablet or phone. There is a regular slot at the start of each meeting for people to raise any issues. If they can't be answered straight away, the Council can take them away and respond afterwards. The minutes of each meeting are published on the new Parish Council website

We continue to campaign to persuade Essex Highways to repair and restore the lovely Boxted Bridge, near Boxted Mill, rather than replace it with a new bigger structure. The Save Our Bridge campaign, run by Boxted residents, has a petition with over 4000 signatures. The Parish Council very much supports the local campaign and although discussions with Essex Highways have led to a much better design of the bridge with efforts to imitate the look the existing structure, the Essex Highways team is not moving from its plan to replace the bridge.

Highways originally said that they would submit a planning application to secure permission to replace the bridge, they then said that they were not legally obliged to do this so had decided to use their 'permitted rights' to replace the bridge. But after local pressure from residents and the Parish Council they have reverted to their plan to submit a planning application. This will give interested parties like the **Dedham Vale Society, CPRE** and **Save Britain's Heritage** the opportunity to comment and object. The recent weather has resulted in flooded roads and gardens in several places in the village and has overloaded the waste system resulting in surface sewage flooding. This is very distressing for all involved and we would like to see improvements to the water systems to stop this happening in the future.

Climate change means that we will experience much more winter rain in future, resulting in more local flooding.

It is everyone's responsibility to maintain and keep clear water courses and ditches that are on or adjacent to their property. We hope that increased awareness will mean that ditches are cleared and build-up removed, so improving our chances of not seeing water or sewage in our properties.

Talking about weather, we would like to express our sincere thanks to the volunteers that have managed to salt some of the more dangerous pathways and corners that aren't part of the Essex gritting routes. We probably don't cover all treacherous paths, but if you know of a difficult area that you

would be able to grit with parish council provided salt then please let the Clerk know.

We very much hope to develop a **Rural Exception Site** providing a small number of lower rental cost housing for local people. The Council will work with the Rural Community Council of Essex to work through the process.

ockdown means we still can't have organised sport at the Recreation Ground, so no football, and the Hub café and Village Hall area is still closed to the public until the lifting of restrictions is confirmed. The play areas are open but please know that the equipment is not cleaned. You should either bring hand sanitiser or get hands washed as soon as possible.

We should be installing seven pieces of outdoor gym equipment alongside the **children's play area** soon; we are just waiting for permissions from Colchester Borough Council. This project was in response to the village questionnaire that identified many residents suggesting more should be available on the field.

We haven't yet been able to take ownership of the corner grassed area of the Hill Farm development at Boxted Cross as a Village Green.

Council are working on a pilot of wildflower verges? We are following this with interest as we may be able to negotiate some areas of verge to be left wild in Boxted too.



The Parish Council has launched a **facebook page** so do pop along and send us a like. We shall try and make sure that posts are also shared to other village groups.

Langham Community Shop - Past, Present & Future

t's hard to believe that our Community Shop has been trading for over 16 years and has recently passed its 10th anniversary in permanent premises! Time flies, and with all the recent changes adapting to the pandemic, this important milestone slipped past almost unnoticed. But as we hopefully begin a return towards normality, now seems a good time to reflect on how we got to where we are today, and look forward to the future.

The last commercial Village Shop closed in 2002. The village seemed to lose its heart and focal point. The idea for a Community Shop came from a group making soup for the village Bonfire Night in 2002. There followed almost two years of meetings, fundraising, legal wrangles, setbacks and delays. The Community Centre was the obvious location as it is central, well used and has a car park. Initial discussions with planners resulted in a refusal of permission for an extension, but a temporary structure was authorised and our 'green cabin' was the result. It was positioned on the 13th September 2004; the shop opened fully on the 16th October 2004.



After one year of trading the outstanding loans had all been cleared, and a paid part time manager was appointed to work with and coordinate the efforts of the team of volunteers. Sadly. over time we were affected by rural Post Office closures and the post office facilities were reduced, but we now have an extremely popular Outreach Post Office providing a full service on Monday mornings (9am to 12.30) and Thursday afternoons (12.30 until 4).

The temporary planning permission became an issue and in 2009 the Parish & Community Councils produced a plan to extend the Community Centre to provide a purpose built Preschool and a permanent site for the Shop. Many funding sources were sought, with

Sure-Start and the Plunkett Foundation both providing substantial amounts. The building was finished in December 2010; the new Shop was formally opened on 22nd January 2011.

An amazing team of local volunteers have now clocked up over 16 years' continuous operation of a 364-day-a-year service for the village. Things have not always been easy, with rich and lean periods, but a strong core of committed



volunteers have continued to move the shop forwards, now led by Manager Charlotte Parker.

The arrival of COVID, which has changed so much in all our lives, has only served to re-inforce the value of a friendly local shop at the heart of our village. The shop has of course had to adapt. An emergency local home-delivery service was introduced in early April 2020 – a new service which continues to this day. The shop has also established a number of new outdoor-based services as

restrictions have allowed. These have included Autumn and Christmas Fayres and the encouragement of weekly scheduled visits by various mobile vendors to complement the shop's existing range of products and services.

ur next event is the Easter Market (www.langhamessex.org.uk/eastermarket) offering an abundance of delicious food, drink and treats for the Easter weekend. The shop has expanded into other areas to provide more of a complete service, for greetings cards, gifts and luxury foods for special dates, trying to offer an alternative to heading to large stores or into town. Our volunteers are always ready with a warm (but



COVID-secure!) welcome, and we hope to see you soon.

The next 10 years will undoubtedly bring fresh challenges. The village population is also set to grow significantly with the new housing estates being built along School Road and we will take this in our stride. We are always happy to receive feedback on how best to serve you. We are always pleased to welcome new volunteers to the team to ensure that the shop stays open, come rain or shine, for 364 days each year.


