We all wish Ann a happy retirement from the role and would like her to know that all her hard work has been appreciated. Particular salm 23 is an age-old Psalm, one that many people are familiar with, and is believed to be written by David, the Hebrew king who lived around 970 BC.

Before becoming a king, David was a shepherd boy, and he used his experiences to write about how to journey well through troubling times. Hornestreet Nature Reserve A Hidden Gem in Langham

The name *Hornestreet* has been associated with part of Langham for many years. Indeed, on an early map of 1840, part of Greyhound Hill, (past Black Brook) was called *Horne Street*. Later Ordnance Survey maps highlighted *Hornestreet* as an area of ground just off Greyhound Hill.

The field which is now Hornestreet Nature Reserve was in the early 1900's part of Langham Hall Estate. In 1935, two fields were purchased by Guy Spencer to create a farm based at Oak Apple Farm, Greyhound Hill. This

became a fruit farm with fruit trees planted up to School Road and on the land which is now Hornestreet Nature Reserve. Local historian Simon Gallup records that the field now occupied by the Nature Reserve was a Morello cherry orchard at one time during the years 1940 -1970, and also housed a piggery and cold store. The existing public footpath from Greyhound Hill was in those days (and still is) the main access to the field in which Hornestreet Nature Reserve is sited. There is another footpath from School Road opposite the Community Centre.

In 1975, Oak Apple Farm was sold and the orchards purchased by another large fruit grower in Langham. It became part of the Williamson Fruit Farms estate, one of the largest fruit farms in the UK.



During the 1980's the main field up to School Road was cleared of the orchards (farmers were paid to remove fruit trees) and was sown with arable crops. The field which is now the Nature Reserve, did not really have much activity as the farm buildings were in a poor state, and what was remaining of the land area was not very productive.

During the nineties, fruit farming was a changing industry and much of the fruit area in the UK was being converted to other crops. In 1999, this 1.5 acre block

of land was offered for sale as it was more or less separate from the larger 10 acre field.

In 1999, when the land went on the market, a few Langham residents were interested in protecting it from developers. At the same time, two Langham residents, Ian Sutherland and the late Gordon Turner were also looking for a piece of land to site the village pond after the original pond dried up. The timing of their desire to find a home for a village pond and other residents wishing to protect the Oak Apple Farm piece of land coincided, and ten village families joined forces to secure the future of this part of Langham.

During the last 21 years a group of Langham residents have transformed this

field into Hornestreet Nature Reserve. With the support of the Dedham Vale AONB team, a pond was created and many trees planted to create the Reserve as you see it today. Many residents donated funds to purchase trees in memory of loved ones. It has truly been a village success story!

Today the Reserve is managed by a small group of residents, but we are always looking out for like-minded volunteers to help keep this gem looking good for the benefit of the community.

Boxted Parish Council Report - June 2021

ur first face to face meeting at the Village Hall since last March. At this month's meeting we met our current Colchester Ward Councillor, Nigel Chapman and also our newly elected Essex County Division Councillor Lewis Barber. We plan to work with Cllrs Chapman and Barber and our neighbouring parishes on a joint plan to look at traffic and highways issues across this rural area. We hope that by working together we can have a stronger voice when trying to persuade Essex Highways and Colchester Borough of the need for improvements especially when it comes to safer routes for pedestrians and cyclists.

We hope to hear that the village green is transferred to parish council ownership and we have been looking at the original landscaping plan and hoping to put in place a maintenance contract that keeps the green in keeping with the original plan. The main grass area will be reseeded in the autumn with wildflowers (they didn't get established last year) and we hope to have a meadow-styled green next year with paths cut through the wildflower lawn. The edges will be kept shorter.

We have several people interested in biodiversity and Cllr Jon Hunt will be getting in touch shortly to organise an exchange of ideas and plans. For Councils this time of the year is very much focused on audit. Our internal audit is complete, our accounts for last year are published on our website, as is our budget for this year. We now enter the external audit process.

The residents' **Save Our Bridge** campaign is still active. Essex Highways still seem determined to replace Boxted Bridge, by Boxted Mill, despite their own commissioned surveys and reports saying it should be repaired given its heritage.

e continue to campaign for change to the current admissions policy for the new Trinity School so that Boxted children can feed automatically to it. The current position is that Boxted children would more likely go to St Helena, driving past Trinity School, and Lexdenbased children would drive past St Helena to get to Trinity School which is nonsensical.

The Village Hall is open again for bookings. We have seen the 44th **Colchester Scout Group** using the Hall and field as a temporary home. They will now be returning to their normal base but being in Boxted has been very successful. The group would like to try and launch a Beaver group or even Cub group in the village. Boxted Bridge

An update has been posted on the Boxted Bridge webpage to advertise coring investigations planned for **5th - 9th July at Boxted Bridge on Wick Road.** These activities will establish the extent of the existing foundations at the abutments and support any future plans for the bridge. The advertised dates may change if the works are affected by poor weather or if unexpected issues arise. During this period it will be necessary to temporarily close Wick Road at Boxted Bridge until the works are complete due to the restricted working area. No vehicles will be permitted to pass over the structure until the road is reopened. Signed diversions will be in place during the closure and nearby residential properties will remain accessible from either side of the structure. Access for pedestrians and dismounted cyclists will be possible over the structure during these activities.

s any man who beavers away on a project in a shed at the end of their garden will tell you, the process can be extremely rewarding emotionally, but can also be a lonely one.

It's worse for those who have retired from regular work or have lost their life partner and as a result find themselves at a loose end.

That's where **men's sheds** come in. They offer a space for guys to meet up for a chinwag and a coffee – but most of all to enjoy making stuff. The idea started in Australia and now the **Men's Sheds Network** is spreading its tentacles worldwide. Think Women's Institute – but without the women and the regular speakers.

Langham now has its own such facility: the North Colchester

Men's Shed is one of the more recent additions to a list of more than 600 in the UK.

The shed itself is far from being a wooden hut. The North Colchester version is actually a brick-built barn which has been carefully transformed by the

founder members over the past 18 months.

Years of decaying cow dung were swept away; floors were levelled and walls painted; doors now secure the premises and the rusted old fuse box has been replaced by one that passes the latest regulations.



The shed is now equipped with a range of work benches together with a seating area where members can relax in comfort

during the all-important tea breaks.

"Sheds are about meeting likeminded people and having someone to share your worries

and smiles with. They are about having fun, sharing skills and knowledge with like-minded people and gaining a renewed sense of purpose and belonging," said Roger Newnham, chairman of the North Colchester shed.

Enhanced recovery after joint replacement starts before the operation.

The pandemic has resulted in a service backlog in the NHS, especially in orthopaedics where people are waiting much longer for joint replacement operations. We know that just sitting around with arthritic joints (especially knees) results in de-conditioning and weakness, loss of confidence, decreased mobility and more pain. A pre-operative programme that focuses on keeping you fit, mobile and strong can help prevent those problems getting worse. The Chartered Society of Physiotherapy has also recently endorsed the need for waiting list support programmes.

At Physio 3.0, we are launching our new E.R.P (Enhanced Recovery Programme) to boost recovery after hip and knee joint replacement surgery. We are working collaboratively with senior clinicians in our network to develop and deliver this service.

So, what does our E.R.P involve?

The programme is designed specifically for each individual but will be a combination of mobility, strengthening, general fitness and balance training. There is also a strong education component which will help you understand your procedure and give you confidence for your recovery. You will have 3 sessions with us starting around 12 weeks (or less if appropriate) before your planned surgery date. We will begin with an initial assessment in week 1, a review session in week 6 and then an exit review session in week 12. We will monitor your progress through the programme by taking initial measurements and then re-measuring these as we work through the programme with you.

And the benefits?

There is evidence that a pre-operative programme can help you:

- · Halt further de-conditioning while you wait for your operation
- Better manage your pain before and after the operation
- Get you home quicker
- · Feel more confident in getting back to your daily activities
- Move more before and after the operation

As with most things in life, you will get out what you put into the programme. Your commitment is a vital ingredient for success.


