A recent chance encounter provided another link across a great span of years. I was in the churchyard admiring the re-used Roman tiles that have been incorporated into the tower and walls, when I met an elderly visitor and her friend and struck up a conversation during which I learnt that she is the daughter of a former vicar, and grew up in the village — from the context I imagine this would have been during World War II. I hope to meet her again and learn more on her next visit. I'll let you know what I find out.

Update on Village Facilities Survey

ack in Spring 2021 the Parish Council commenced a major piece of work to better understand residents' views on the existing amenities, events and activities within the village. This will help us set priorities and establish projects to improve the village amenities over the coming years.

By the end of June, we received 173 individual responses to our initial survey. 132 were submitted in paper format; 41 were submitted online. Collating all this detailed information into a single 'database' was quite an onerous task, but this is now complete thanks to the sterling efforts of a Working Group comprising Tony Emms, Maureen Shouksmith, John Palmer, James Puxley and Martin Bottwood.

Thanks are also due to everybody that took the time and trouble to respond to our survey, giving us better insight into what is most important to Langham residents.

This article presents just a quick 'snapshot' of the initial survey findings and the follow-on activities that are now being planned. More detailed information will be published on the LPC website shortly. A village briefing meeting will also be held later in October (date TBC).

Existing amenities:

52% of respondents felt that existing amenities meet their needs, but 60% also felt that there was scope for improvements. The Recreation Ground received a mean score of about 7.5/10, but a rather lower rating regarding events and activities held on it (mean score about 5.5/10).

The Community Centre also received a mean overall score of about 7.5/10. The Shop received the highest mean score of about 9/10. Survey returns for the Pre-School were too low to be statistically meaningful.

Potential new amenities:

The two top scoring infrastructure ideas were medical facilities (110 'votes') and a coffee shop/cafeteria (105 'votes'). 37 people 'voted' for allotments; 30 people 'voted' for a gymnasium. The three top scoring event ideas were a Christmas Market, a Bonfire Night and a Summer Show, all of which received more than 120 'votes'. Many other ideas for new social events, clubs and suggested activities were also by respondents. If we can match up some of these innovative ideas with the necessary volunteers to help run them, exciting times might lie ahead! With that in mind, we were truly delighted that more than 60 people expressed a potential interest in volunteering to help organise new village events. An initial meeting was held at the Community Centre on 23rd September, where these ideas were explored further.

The initial survey analysis work is now complete. The next phases of work will look at taking forward as many ideas as possible within the practical constraints of time, money and volunteer resources. Ideas generated from the survey are being categorised into five groups to help organise the follow-on work.

Group 1: the major opportunities and top priority items to be explored and if possible taken forwards. Some will be complex and challenging, but we recognise their importance to the village.

Group 2: other opportunities to consider for progression. Some of these may be quicker and simpler to deliver.

Group 3: opportunities to be explored in conjunction with the LCC, Shop & Pre-School.

Group 4: opportunities that will require support from higher tiers of government (CBC, ECC, Essex Highways etc.)

Group 5: survey ideas which, for various reasons, we do not anticipate taking forwards at this time.

We look forward to providing further updates as we start to develop implementation plans for at least some of the ideas included in Groups 1-3 above. Further details will be published on the LPC website as plans take shape. t's that time of the year when the seasons are changing. The leaves are falling from the trees and the days are getting shorter. There are Harvest celebrations in schools and in churches, crops have been cut and collected, and fruits and vegetables are picked ready to be sold, stored or frozen for us to use. Harvest is the end of a process that has seen farmers and gardeners cultivate and tend their crops, from the initial sowing of the seeds through to the moment the resulting produce is ripe and ready something to celebrate.

But it may be that we don't feel like celebrating because the gloomier days affect our mood, and some people experience something called SAD (Seasonal Affective Disorder) syndrome. This can lead to us feeling a bit low, tired, not enjoying everyday activities, and sometimes might cause us to eat unhealthy food. I'd like to encourage us all to focus on our faith, to lean into God, and seek help and support from Him, and others. His mood never changes, He is always delighted when we choose to spend time with Him in prayer, or meet together in church.

In the last book of the Bible there is a wonderful description of a river flowing through Jerusalem, and a verse that says, "On each side of the river stood the tree of life, bearing twelve crops of fruit, yielding its fruit every month. And the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations." (*Revelation 22.2*) This is a wonderful picture of the world as it will be in the future, evoking images of the garden of Eden where God originally created a beautiful world for us to live in.

The pandemic has caused many people to experience loss and suffer grief in many ways, but the encouragement is that, in time, God will heal all our sadness and disappointments and restore our relationship with Him and with each other.

Boxted Parish Council Report - September 2021

e had lots of members of the public come along to our September meeting as well as our Colchester Ward Councillor, Nigel Chapman and our Essex County Councillor (ECC) Lewis Barber.

The big issues raised were, firstly, the plan to site a 16m high 5G telecoms mast on the Essex County Council verge on the edge of the Village Green. Most people understood the need for better mobile communications but felt the site proposed was a poor choice. The Council decided to lodge an objection based on the location and look of the proposed mast being at odds with the landscape character of the rural setting in Boxted.

The second issue concerning those residents present was the notification that has been received by some stating Colchester Homes' intention to develop the site, known locally as the Garage site, for social housing. We haven't had much information and decided to invite Colchester Amphora Homes to a Parish meeting.

Thirdly, was the issue of congestion and parking at school drop off and pick up times. Cllr Barber is organising a meeting of the Travel Planning Officer Highways, North Essex Parking Partnership, Boxted School, and the Parish Council to see what workable options could be implemented. This issue is common to a lot of villages and is very difficult to solve but we anticipate making some headway. In the meantime, the Parish Council is creating (subject to planning) an all-weather route to grassed parking on the Recreation Ground which might help.

he uncertainty around Highways plans for Boxted Bridge goes on. Residents and the Council have been promised sight of the proposals for eight months, but nothing is available to us yet. When we see the plans, we will hold a public meeting to get people's views. The residents Save Our Bridge campaign is still very active.

Councillors will walk along Straight Road trying to identify what of the verge and hedging can be strongly cut back to enable people to walk on the verge rather than in the road.

There is good input from residents about areas of the village green that should be planted with wildflowers and pollinators.

Sadly, the Community Hub has closed. We have plans to refurbish the Hub building which would see a remodelling of the sports changing room side and the provision of extra kitchen space and

more toilets for the café side. Therefore, a short-term lease is being advertised which could be extended after the refurbishment by mutual consent. Do look at boxtedparishcouncil.org.uk for more information.




