#### The Friends of St Peter's Boxted and Care of the Churchyard

St Peter's must be the oldest and most significant historic building in Boxted. However, its churchyard is in urgent need of additional care and attention

The Friends of St Peter's ('the Friends') is a registered charity, separate from both the Parish Church Council and the Chelmsford Diocese, whose main objective is to help fund the maintenance of the Grade 1 Listed church building and its churchyard.

The Parish Church Council has recently approved a detailed plan to provide the urgent care and attention to the churchyard and the Friends have agreed to both co ordinate the necessary work and to organise funding for it.

The plan aims to retain the character of an English country churchyard whilst both better managing the vegetation growth and increasing bio-diversity and includes:

- removing the encroaching vegetation from some gravestones and the east and west boundary brick walls
- replanting the derelict hedge on the north boundary adjacent to the Essex Way path with a new hedge comprising native species plants

- migrating much of the grassed area to a properly managed bio-diverse native wildflower area
- improving the surface and edging of the main path

Some of the work will need to be done by professional contractors. but most will hopefully be done by volunteers. The Friends hope to recruit a pool of volunteers who are prepared to donate some of their time by joining occasional working parties, probably monthly for two or three hours on Saturday mornings. Appropriate refreshments will be provided. Volunteers need only bring their enthusiasm and the sole commitment will be to join in working parties when they are available. Care will be taken to ensure that the working parties will be well organised so that no one's time is wasted

he group's winter programme of talks resumed September when in **Janette** Robinson told members about the remarkable life of Flora Sandes. Her father was a vicar in Suffolk and she enjoyed an affluent upbringing, allowing her to indulge in many activities more usually enjoyed by men including racing her sports car at Brooklands.

When WWI began she took up nursing with the Red Cross but regulations at the time prevented her serving abroad. Not to be deterred, she joined the Serbian army (an ally) with a number of like-minded ladies

and began her career in a Serbian hospital.

When Serbia was invaded, she joined the Army Ambulance Service, becoming the only western woman to see active service including combat. She was promoted to the rank of corporal, but later seriously wounded and hospitalised, subsequently decorated and promoted again firstly to sergeant major and later to officer—becoming the first woman to be put in charge of men.

fter the war, she returned to Orford but found life difficult as a civilian woman. Eventually she married a retired Russian officer and moved to Paris, then Belgrade. When Germany invaded in 1942, she returned once more to Orford and died in Ipswich hospital in 1952.

## Langham Parish Council

# September/October 2021

he last few weeks have seen two changes to Parish Council personnel. Tony Ellis took his wellearned retirement at the end of August after many years of service for the Council. Although Tony had a number of roles on the Council his major contribution was as Chairman of the planning committee. Over the years he successfully navigated his way through the complexities of the planning system and the loss of his vast experience and contact base will present a challenge to Council moving forward. His dry sense of humour and the attention to grammatical detail will also be missed. John Palmer was co-opted on to the Council at our 6th October meeting. This follows on from his valuable recent volunteer work on the Village Survey Working Group. Our Recreation Ground Committee has overseen some significant remedial work over recent weeks. Our current Play Area contractor, Wicksteed, has completed some

necessary repairs to the floor matting and edging around a number of items of equipment, so as to minimise potential tripping hazards. These repairs represent an interim measure only, pending current planning for a more substantial upgrade of the entire Play Area. We are looking to modernise and improve the facilities available and also introduce some new equipment which will appeal to older children. A major programme of hedge trimming and ditch clearance has recently been completed. The Village Sign at Pond Corner had also been earmarked for renovation and it was taken down in mid-October to be sent away for restoration and repainting.

The Parish Council is continuing to monitor the current pause in the major Vistry Homes (formerly Linden Homes) development on School Road. Planning Condition 21, regarding adequate waste water treatment facilities at Langham WRC, remains the major sticking point. The Environment Agency have recently written to the Council (and also to Sir

Bernard Jenkin) with an update. Further information can be found on the Parish Council website (under Notice Board\Vistry Homes Current Situation).

Facilities Survey, a Volunteers' Meeting was held at the LCC on 23<sup>rd</sup> September to discuss the restoration and development of future village events and the need for a new generation of volunteers to help make this happen. A further useful meeting was held with LCC Trustees on 4<sup>th</sup> October. Thanks to the efforts of a small volunteer leader team, it is now hoped that

some detailed implementation plans can soon be drawn up for a Platinum Jubilee Celebration Event in early June next year. It is also our firm intention to re-instate the much-missed Langham Bonfire Night Event in November 2022.

# BOXTED BAND'S STAR BILLING IN LONDON

oxted Methodist Silver Band made such an impression when it played at Methodist Central Hall in Westminster on Sunday 26th September that it has been asked to make a return visit next year. The Band – the country's only surviving Methodist Silver Band provided music for hymns during the morning service at what is regarded by many as the "cathedral" of Methodism in this country. After the service the Band gave a concert. This was the fourth major public performance by the 30-strong band since the lifting of Covid-19

restrictions, following two successful concerts in July and August in Colchester Castle Park and one outside Boxted Village Hall. Further bookings at different venues have been received up to Christmas and into next year.

his is not the first time members have played at an impressive location. Two years ago the Band played in the Queen's private chapel at Windsor Castle.

The last two years have been challenging for the Band, but it has emerged from the pandemic with a slight increase in the number of players. Members continued to meet



informally by zoom on the usual Wednesday practice night and, when regulations allowed, met at Langham Community Centre with covers on their instruments and sitting at a distance from one another.



Colchester Methodist Circuit shut Boxted Methodist Chapel in July 2019, and the Band became homeless when the School Room was sold. But the Band was determined to play on, retaining the word Methodist in its name. However, because of Covid -19, practice evenings have been few and those that could be held took place at Langham with strict compliance requirements. Its core value is still that of "playing to the glory of God" which has been the Band's motto throughout its 123year existence. Its repertoire is more than just that for Christian worship, and a wide range of music is played. The prospect of the Band leaving Boxted then became a possibility, although the hope always was that a new home could be found in the

village – and that hope has been fulfilled thanks to the generosity of Fillpots Garden Centre where the Band has commenced its regular Wednesday evening rehearsals in the setting of the glazed roof café, prompting some to comment that they are probably the only band in the country that plays in a glass house!

he Band is grateful to the owner of Fillpots, Mr Richard Brann, for making the premises available, thus ensuring the Band remains in Boxted.

With its new home in Boxted, and a membership which has remained united despite being made homeless, the Band's future looks promising, with further bookings for the rest of this year and into next year having been confirmed.

#### Councillor Lewis Barber

It has been an enjoyable first few months as your county councillor, working on the issues that matter to you. I wish to set out some of these. If you would like to get in touch on any of the below or any other matter, my contact details are at the end.

In the election, I promised that I would tackle road safety. Road safety, alongside wider traffic issues, are one of the top reasons I am contacted. That is why I have been working with Borough Councillor Nigel Chapman and the Parish Council to identify the challenges and find the appropriate solutions to improve road safety and traffic management. In Boxted, we have agreed to complete several traffic surveys to gauge exactly the key locations that need tackling. These are a Highways requirement before proposing solutions. These surveys will give us 24/7 information on road usage, speed and type of vehicle so that we can most effectively come up with the correct solutions.

In Langham, the Parish Council will be completing their village wide survey and I look forward to discussing the results with them and moving to the next steps. There will be improvements to the size and frequency of 30 mph speed limit repeater signs down Wick Lane that will be implemented by Essex Highways shortly. However, it is recognised that there are wider issues that need addressing.

It is also a determination of mine that Parish Councils work together to address wider traffic issues, such as 'rat runs' and the work being completed in both villages will help us draw up a Highways Plan to do so.

The delays with the opening of Trinity School's permanent site and the general admissions policy is a concern for many. It is a priority of mine to ensure that this permanent site is open at the earliest opportunity so that we can adequately match the demand for local school places. I am working with stakeholders to ensure this is the case and to assure concerns about secondary school places more widely.

In **Boxted**, I know that parking outside of the primary school is an issue for many, both in the village and for parents. I recently arranged a meeting on site to see the challenges first-hand and to discuss how we can improve the situation. This is difficult but we will be putting out a separate note soon to the village and parents to gauge views on possible solutions. The school is working positively with us to find a solution and it has recently opened up the parking in the school gates to help ease the parking.

he bridge on Severalls Lane over the A12 is the responsibility of Highways England (which is separate from Essex County Council) and so I have been pushing

it for further information and timescales to fully open the bridge. The last update I received was that Highways England was awaiting test and survey results on the bridge. This was some time ago now and I have been promised an update, at the time of writing this article, within the next week or so. In similar fashion, I am still awaiting plans from Essex Highways for Boxted Bridge. But I, alongside other interested parties, have held meetings with the design team to express our and the communities' views on the bridge. I will share an update as soon as I have one.

In more positive news, I have secured the resources for Langham Lane to be repaired from 24th November to 26th November. This will involve road closures. I am trying to secure extra resources to extend these repairs to Severalls Lane and Langham Road too. The High Street in Langham will also be closed from 22nd November to 24th November for repairs. I continue to work to get a fair deal for our rural highway network. Please do get in touch if you know of any defects.

Finally, a passion of mine is improving public transport and active travel opportunities for rural communities. Essex County Council has launched its **Bus Back Better** strategy and I am keen to hear from the communities any thoughts about how to improve the bus strategy. If you use the buses currently,

what could be done better? If you do not, what would need to change so that you would use them? Please do let me know so I can ensure these are incorporated into the strategy. I am also keen that rural communities get their fair share of investment into active travel infrastructure, such as improving footpaths. Essex County Council has funding to draw up a rural active travel plan so any ideas you have please do also let me know. One area that I am already working on is the access to Northern Gateway area from Boxted and Langham as opposed to use Severalls having Lane. to Colchester Borough Council and Essex County Council both acknowledge this needs to improve and we are arranging a funding agreement to begin doing so.

# Could YOU be a Bloodrunner?

The Essex Voluntary Blood Service – or Essex

Bloodrunners for short— is a charity providing medical courier services to the NHS and our local Air Ambulances. We are one of 30 such organisations in the UK.



Get Blood Runn

From the NHS Blood Bank at Basildon, our unpaid volunteers deliver blood and blood products to A&E Hospitals in Essex and East London; deliver samples for analysis to a NHS Lab in North

London, and via Princess Alexandra Hospital in Harlow, supply blood to the Air Ambulances at Earls Colne and North Weald every night. Amongst many other tasks we also courier breast milk from donors to the Hearts Milk Bank and Addenbrooke's Hospital.

We operate every weekday night, and day and night shifts at weekends and Bank Holidays. Our enhanced support to Hospitals during the Covid-19 pandemic has also introduced a weekday daytime shift. We now need more members. You choose in advance the days and shifts you work. We are looking for reliable and responsible men and women from all backgrounds, employed or retired, with a

motorcycle, car or van, a mobile phone and internet access. You will receive training, documentation, full support and a hi-viz uniform jacket.

You will work alone on a delivery run with a typical

round-trip distance from home of between 60 and possibly over 120 miles, and be the face of Essex Bloodrunners to the public and NHS staff. The work is not glamorous; can be tiring; you may work

unsocial hours in all weathers and you will add thousands of miles to your vehicle. You are unpaid and cover all your own expenses... so not much going for it really!

However, rather like being a First Aider or Blood Donor, this is one

of the very few ways that an ordinary member of the public can help **save a life**.

# Boxted Parish Council Report - October 2021

Ithough Covid had struck the households of some of our councillors we had enough councillors to have a quorate meeting which was also attended by our Colchester Ward Councillor, Nigel Chapman and some members of the public.

Of particular concern is that
Colchester Borough Council
Amphora Homes have said they
plan to develop on what we know
locally as the garage site (behind
Cross Cottages) but Amphora are
not yet sharing any detail in what
they are proposing to do. It is
possible that space given over for
allotments will be removed and
this led to some discussion of the
possible requirement for
allotments by use by residents. If
you have any ideas or suggestions,
please do get in touch.



We have been notified that the planned 5G telecoms mast on the Essex County Council verge on the edge of the Village Green has been initially refused by Colchester Borough Council. We are hoping to engage with the surveyors to find a more suitable site that meets the technical criteria but is better located visually.

There are several blocked road gullies along Straight Road which we think contribute to the localised road flooding, which is not helped when water can't run into ditches easily. If there is a ditch alongside your property, you are probably responsible for keeping it clear of debris and vegetation. In the

meantime, we keep reporting the blocked gullies to Essex Highways.

The Council did agree to fund an additional dog waste bin and collection service and ask for it to be located at the Workhouse Hill end of the Harwich Lines public footpath.

The roads seem to be getting busier and speeding is a concern of residents. We may fund some monitoring exercises to get a baseline data set of evidence on volume and speed of traffic coming through the village.


The Council voted to install additional play equipment of the Recreation Ground. We will publish what we think might be popular on the Council facebook page.

esidents and businesses are set to receive some of the fastest and most reliable broadband speeds in the UK as work to build a new full-fibre broadband network in the village enters the final stages.

Much of the village currently only has access to Superfast broadband which, even though it is often promoted as 'fibre', relies on copper cables which reduce speed and performance.

Hyperfast full-fibre delivers fibre cables directly into the home with download and uploads speeds of up to 1,000Mbps.

County Broadband, a specialist rural provider, is building the new networks in dozens of villages across the

county. Speeds over 10 times faster than the UK average will be available.

The East of England full-fibre broadband provider, funded by a multi-million-pound private investment from Aviva Investors, has confirmed that Langham has met the sign-up target required to give the green light to start construction.

www.countybroadband.co.uk.

James Salmon, from County Broadband, said: "Your broadband may be fine for now, but it won't be able to keep up in a few years' time as Superfast networks can't get any faster or more reliable.

"That's why we're building full -fibre infrastructure to future-proof the village. No other providers currently plan to offer this service so make sure you place a pre-order."




