

Welcome to the March Newsletter.

y the time you read this, the seasons should have turned and glorious spring should be in the air.

Birdsong and crocuses (croci?) are much in evidence in my garden this morning.

A thousand years ago, this time of year was called *Lencten* —from which we get our word "Lent". *Lencten* actually means 'lengthening of days' as we move away from the midwinter gloom towards Easter. It was the time when tilling and sowing could be undertaken., serious agricultural work could resume and preparations for the year to come were underway.


The month of March had three different names back then. The church-calendar name was based on the Roman term *mensis Martis* (the month of the god Mars).

One English name was *Hreòmonaò*. (pronounced roughly *raith-mon-ath*). It is mentioned by Bede in the 8th century in one of his works on the calculation of time (*De Tempore Ratione*) and is said to refer to an old spring-goddess called *Hreda*. Her name probably means 'rough' or 'fierce' so it is not the benevolent aspect of spring that was being celebrated.

Elsewhere, in a poem commemorating saints' feast days, March is called *Hlyde* 'the loud month' or 'the torrential month' probably due to the fierce winds which accompany the rising temperature.

At the foot of this page is a Victorian drawing based on a 10th-11th century English calendar showing workmen out in the countryside in March. The man on the right is harrowing the soil with a tool called a *falging* while his colleague is broadcasting the seeds. Centre left is a man at work with a *spadu* (spade) and behind him another with a *mattuc* (mattock) - swinging it rather dangerously, in my view No sign of a hi-ves vest or trip-hazard warning sign was included in the vignette — most of the workers in these calendar images don't even have shoes!


Following the closure of Boxted Methodist Church in 2019 it is now based at Fillpots Garden Centre in Boxted Straight Road.

Boxted Parish Council Report - February

B oxted Parish Council met on the 9th February 2022 with Councillor Seakens as the temporary Chair of the Council. Mr Amin Dedhar is the latest, and very welcome, Councillor to join Boxted PC. This still leaves one vacant position which the Council can fill by co-option. Anyone interested in applying for the vacancy has until the 28 March to submit a short application and be prepared for an in-public discussion at the Council meeting on 13 April.

Several residents came to the meeting to see what the Councils' views are on the submitted planning application to develop the former garage site behind Cross Cottages which has been used for many years as parking for the cottages. Boxted Council will submit an objection to the application based on the displacement of parking that will result. Insufficient parking provision is planned for both the new residential units, and the current parking for Cross Cottages. The concerns are for child safety at school start and finish times and the roadside parking that will result along Dedham Road. This application will remove garden space used as allotments. Anyone interested in an allotment in the village should email/write to the Parish

Council as we would like to understand the requirement for allotments.

The Council was pleased to see the Colchester Borough Council objection submitted regarding Essex Highways Plans to replace the Boxted Bridge over the Stour River. This was a strongly worded assertion that insufficient weight had been given to repair and conservation in the Dedham Vale AONB which is required by law. The application has not yet been decided by Essex County Council, but we are hopeful that Highways will reconsider.

The final planning application which concerns the village is the new Anglian Water pipeline that will bring water through Boxted. There is a good public information website showing the planned route and efforts to minimise disruption and Boxted Council will register interest in preserving hedges and trees.

The Carter family had asked if they can design and donate a round metal bench for the central tree on the village green which would include a dedication to the Carter family, which the Council approved.

The Council had a good discussion on improving the lighting in the Village Hall Car Park to help people when leaving either the Hall or the Hub in the dark. We will investigate low level lighting that will only come on for a short period when needed.

A nearby Parish had asked if Boxted wished to share in the costs and use of a portable flashing speed sign, but the Council decided that we needed better information and evidence before committing to any kind of speed sign.

The Community Hub café is busy with Harpers Caffe now providing eat in and take-away from 9am 6-days a week.

The new harder surfaced access roadway on to the field is in place. Hopefully this

will take a bit of pressure off the parking situation especially when the field is busy with sport. The new play equipment is being installed but the 5 a-side football area is delayed until the summer. There are plans to use the Recreation Ground on 5th June as part of the Platinum Jubilee celebrations. BOXTED HISTORY GROUP

hile many of the audience attending last month's talk on the Crystal Palace and the Great Exhibition of 1851 knew about the event, I think few of us realised the size and what was achieved in six months. Conceived to show the skills, technical advances, natural resources and cultures in countries round the world, its success appears

largely due to the enthusiastic support of Queen Victoria's husband, Prince Albert.

Joseph Paxton, the head gardener Chatsworth House, was chosen to design what was a very large iron-framed greenhouse sited in Hyde Park, and as none of the trees could be cut down, it was also tall and imposing.

The Exhibition itself opened in May 1851 and, by the time it closed six months later, more than five million people had visited.



After the Exhibition closed, the palace was dismantled then re-erected in Sydenham but only nine years later, in 1936, it was destroyed by fire.

We had this Exhibition in 1851, the Festival of Britain in 1951 (which many remember) - but will there be another in 2051? Only time will tell.

Langham Parish Council Report

he delayed public meeting with Anglian Water and Sir Bernard Jenkin finally went ahead on 28th January, with a good turnout of more than 40 residents despite the relatively short notice we were given. The notes of that meeting are available on the News page of our

website and may be of particular interest to those who were disappointed not to be able to attend on the day itself. The strength of feeling around longstanding sewerage capacity and overflow issues was made very plain indeed to Anglian Water. Sir Bernard Jenkin concluded the meeting by requesting that a follow up public

meeting be held within 3-6 months to review whether satisfactory progress had been made in addressing residents' ongoing concerns. One 'quick win' was achieved from the meeting: Anglian Water have now confirmed that sludge lorry movements are being restricted to daytime operation between 7am and 8pm daily with immediate effect, thereby removing the night-time disturbances that have afflicted Greyhound Hill residents in particular. Between now and the next public meeting, Anglian Water will continue a dialogue with LPC about their enhanced flow monitoring program, as well as our wider concerns about capacity, overflows, and discharge permit non-compliance.

The **Recreation Ground Committee** have concluded their series of 'drop-in' sessions regarding improvement proposals for the Play Area and are now firming up on a detailed specification to take out to playground equipment suppliers for competitive tender.

The results of November's **Traffic Survey** have now been compiled and analysed. They were published on our website and social media on 14th February, together with a first draft action plan inviting comments by the end of February. High on the priority list is a mobile VAS/SID (Vehicle Activated Speed Indicator Device) for flexible deployment at a number of speeding hotspots around the village. We are unlikely to receive any Essex County Council funding towards this initiative, so we are currently investigating cost-sharing options with other parishes. Village Gateways were also extremely popular in the survey results and these are now being actively investigated.

V ou may recall that a major planning application for a huge food storage and distribution centre on the Old Ipswich Road, Ardleigh was rejected back in the summer of 2020. At that time, both Ardleigh PC and Langham PC submitted formal objections, along with many local residents from both Parishes. The plan has now been resubmitted and Ardleigh PC are looking to establish a joint initiative with Dedham PC and Langham PC to consider the Highways & related matters that cut across the Parish boundaries. We will endeavour to support this new initiative.

The Platinum Jubilee Planning

Committee are making excellent progress in putting in place an exciting program of celebratory activities across the long bank holiday weekend of 2nd-5th June. Read more about it elsewhere in this month's Parish Newsletter; watch out for the billboards that will be springing up around the village in early March; and do please consider getting actively involved to help make this June a memorable one for Langham!

We have received a small number of enquiries in response to the recent call for potential **new Councillors** to come forward. These will now be progressed via exploratory chats followed by interviews.
