# Boxted Parish Council Report - March

**B** oxted Parish Council met on the 9th March 2022 with Councillor Seakens as the temporary Chair of the Council.

We still have one vacant position on the Council. Anyone interested in applying for the vacancy has until the 28 March to submit a short application and be prepared for an in -public discussion at the Council meeting on 13 April.

Several residents came to the meeting to discuss the former garage site behind **Cross Cottages** which has been used for many years as parking for the cottages. The planning application consultation is now closed, and we are waiting to see what is next.

We also had an update from residents saying that there appears to be another Essex Highways document for consultation regarding Boxted Bridge. The Parish Council agreed to wait until invited by Essex Planning to consult on all the new information that is due.

Much of the new play equipment, including aerial runway, mega swing, teenage spinner, sunken trampolines, an all-accessible roundabout, additional small play area rocker, extended trim trail and large climbing piece is installed and being used and a resident asked if the Council could also consider a nest swing. The 5-aside football posts are delayed until the summer because of the difficulty in sourcing the goals.

The volunteer biodiversity group are beginning to turn their attention to what work might be needed on our public rights of way (footpaths and bridleways) and how to make them known to residents. A booklet produced many years ago is a really nice description of walks around Boxted and the group might look to update this and also make it available online.

A volunteer, thank you Julie, has set up a lending library in the Boxted telephone box after the council put up shelving. We hope that people take advantage of it.

Highlights of his primary school days were comics (Beano & Dandy) followed by books (Just William, Biggles).

Teenage years brought radio with *Dick Barton, Special* 

Agent and Journey Into Space. Ultimately, TV arrived and, when the set worked, BBC could be viewed between the hours of 4.00 and 10.30pm.

The 1960s brought many social changes including Rock'n'Roll, Teddy Boys, Supermarkets and, for some, mobility-scooters. By the end of the evening we all realised what we had forgotten and how the world has changed but is it all for the best?

# Langham Parish Council Report

t took a while, but the Village Sign is now beautifully restored and standing proudly again at Pond Corner on Park Lane! The results of the Village Traffic Survey have been discussed with our County Councillor Lewis Barber, who is supporting our request for Village Gateways to be installed on the Langham Lane and Birchwood Road approaches to the village.

We are actively investigating the costs and best locations for deployment of portable VAS/SID (Vehicle Activated Speed Indicator Devices) around the village. Indicative quotations from three specialist equipment suppliers have been received. Potential cost and equipment sharing with Ardleigh and/ or Great Horkesley is also being looked at (Boxted having declined). Following on from the various consultation exercises about the Play Area at the Recreation Ground, a revised specification for the upgrade project has been circulated to five potential contractors for their consideration and quotation. Once a contractor has been chosen, the likely timescale for the construction work to take place is now autumn 2022.

The re-commencement of the Vistry Homes development on School Road remains on hold at the moment. We wrote to the Environment Agency in late February expressing our continuing concerns about inadequate sewage treatment capacity at Langham WRC, and received a reply in early March confirming that they are now reviewing matters afresh with Anglian Water. Meanwhile, the outline planning application for 30 new homes next to the Community Centre on School Road was formally submitted by Williamson Developments to Colchester Borough Council on 4th March.

The 'Jubilee' & 'Fireworks Display' Committees continue to make excellent progress thanks to the enthusiasm of many villagers in supporting these initiatives. Advertising for the Jubilee Events (on 2nd-5th June) is ramping up with large display boards already in place, and smaller 'day by day' billboards soon to appear outside houses along the main streets of the village. Plans are also shaping up for the return of the **annual fireworks display** to Langham, with this year's display now scheduled for Sat 5th November.

Now Spring is here, keep a look out for hedgehogs as they emerge from hibernation, sleepy, very thirsty and heading for the nearest source of water. Hedgehogs are good swimmers BUT many die in garden ponds as the sides are too steep for them to climb out. Please make your pond hedgehog-proof by creating a sloping edge and a ramp or green thick coated wire anchored at the top and bottom of the pond to provide an escape ladder.



If you are pulling down old sheds or buildings, you may find a hedgehog under there so keep a look out. Finally, when using a strimmer make sure there are no hogs in the vicinity, so many suffer serious injuries every year from strimming accidents. In fact, I'll check the garden for our prickly friends before Mum calls all the dogs for dinner, including me, Kenny (the Boss) Chihuahua.
