Village Green Update

ello, and welcome to the first update from the **Biodiversity** and Sustainability working group. We are an enthusiastic group of volunteers working to improve the environment within and around Boxted. The group has only been active for a few months but yet we have many potential goals, aims and initiatives. We meet once a month to review the progress of current work and discuss potential future work and initiatives. We are still in the process of formalising the group and so are still open to new volunteers who might want to lend their experience, interests or opinions to the group.

Earlier in the year you may have seen the work being undertaken on the new Village Green at Boxted Cross, adjacent to the Hill Farm development. This is a great peaceful space in the heart of the village, but unfortunately it was not delivered to the Parish in quite the condition it was intended. With a budget from the Boxted Parish Council, the group set forth to bring the Green up to a standard of which the village could be proud, with of course, a focus on promoting biodiversity through carefully selected planting of native varieties of plants and hedging. The volunteers of the group have been working hard over numerous weekends and some week days to plant over two thousand flowering bulbs, spreading wildflower seed, mowing the lawns and planting



native hedging. The green has been divided into a number of areas. Two areas have been dedicated to wildflower planting; these are located either side of the central circular bench and oak tree. Around the edges of the green, swathes of flowering bulbs have been planted between and around the existing hedging and fruit trees. Everywhere else the grass is being



maintained by the group as conventional mown lawn so that it may be enjoyed for walking and general use such as picnics. The group's aim has been to plant a rich assortment of native species to enhance the environment in which wildlife can prosper and thrive, but also to make it a beautiful spot for all to visit and enjoy a more naturalised landscape.

A s well as continuing to maintain the Village Green, the group has a number of other initiatives it is beginning to approach such as promoting the use of footpaths within and around the village and determining the necessary requirements for maintaining public rights of way where required and making them more accessible for all. Additionally, the group is looking to publish a

survey to establish the level of interest in, and level of knowledge of; environmental, biodiversity and sustainability topics within the Village. This survey will help us decide how best to progress with our work and what appetite there is in the village for this work. Examples might be: is there an interest or demand for a monthly presentation/ workshop on practical gardening skills, or vegetable growing skills and tips? Would more people in the village like to grow their own vegetables but don't know where to start? That is just one avenue we would be interested to explore.

he group welcomed back to Boxted the well-known local historian, writer and character, Charlie Haylock. He is best known for the many books he has written and talks he has given on the history of the English language, local dialects and in particular the accents found in Suffolk and North Essex. This time, however, he talked about his involvement in the production of the film "The Dig" - the story of the excavation of the Anglo-Saxon burial site at Sutton Hoo, near Woodbridge. Charlie's challenge was to teach all members of the cast with speaking parts how to "speak Suffolk". It eventually took five months with numerous oneto-one sessions with Ralph

Fiennes (who played Basil Brown) and group tutorials with the rest. Ralph completely immersed himself in the part, even to wearing period dress and speaking "Suffolk" until he became Basil Brown. The audience were led to believe that it became necessary for him and Charlie to spend much time in local pubs perfecting his accent and enjoying a pint together. As always, Charlie's talk was interesting, informative, very amusing and with a few saucy incidents thrown in.

O ver the past few months there have been several incidents of fly tipping at the bottom of Cooks Hill, next to the footpath sign. The rubbish has included a cooker, fridge, freezer, 3 mattresses and most recently a large armchair. This is becoming a regular event after each load is cleared away by CBC.

What is doubly disappointing is that the offenders probably live locally and may even be reading this. If they are, then please stop this anti-social behaviour that shows disrespect for your environment and your neighbours. Use the free council facilities at Shrub End or the refuse freighter that comes to the village.

If residents come across fly tipping, it can be reported easily on the CBC website at *www.colchester.gov.uk/street-cleaning/*. They will remove items that are not on landowners' property i.e are on the side of the road, but not in ditches or fields.

Gold on Greote — Treasures in the Soil

gold ring was found somewhere in Langham in September 2021; its Portable Antiquity Scheme reference is SUR-67AB6D.

It probably dates from the 7th century, the age of the great treasures of Sutton Hoo and the Staffordshire Hoard, when such beaded wire rings could be used as finger rings and also as collars on larger display items such as swords.

The findspot is probably near the present course of the A12 and it is especially interesting since a gold sword pommel of the same period was found a few years ago on the other side of the A12 at Ardleigh (PAS reference ESS-27D367).

Gold sword fittings are rare finds and demand attention. Their presence suggests that a (local?) landowner was sufficiently wealthy to own a prized weapon—and a suitably impressive set of wargear to go with it. Doubtless he went to war wearing a crested helmet and an iron mailcoat, and carrying a large shield with gilt-bronze decorations displaying his ancestry and cultural affiliations.

But gold in post-Roman Britain was not in short supply, mostly sourced from melted-down Roman coins. It was used to make beautiful objects such as brooches, rings, necklaces, goblets, tableware and also for decorative fittings for weapons and horse-harness. Gold jewellery set with garnets is the typical combination for the period, seen on the pommel of the Sutton Hoo Mound 1 sword (opposite.)

S ome of the most spectacular such pieces have come from burial mounds like the ones at Sutton Hoo, Prittlewell, Broomfield and elsewhere. Many such mounds were robbed in the past (and sadly sometimes even in the present day) while the creation of canals, railways and modern roads have seen the destruction of many others.

Perhaps a prominent burial mound like the one at Prittlewell once stood beside the A12, the old Roman road from London to the Norfolk coast, and was disturbed in later road-widening. Its contents might have been unnoticed and spread in the spoilheap, then redeposited in the surrounding fields.

Alternatively, the spot may have been the site of a battle in which the sword was lost – and presumably the owner lost his life too, else he would have retrieved so precious a prize. Warfare was endemic in the period which saw new states emerging in the post-Roman world, and new religions. The East Saxons received Christianity three times—twice from Canterbury and later from Suffolk. The clash of competing brands of Christian faith—Roman- and Irish-based— added to the religious confusion of the age.

he 7th century was just the time when the East Saxons were caught up in the competition (and perhaps open warfare) between the wealthier neighbouring kingdoms of Kent and East Anglia. The kings of Essex valiantly resisted the power of both.

Finally, in 662 AD, the Essex king, Swithelm, accepted baptism at Rendlesham in Suffolk, near the tribal burial ground at Sutton Hoo, then a royal palace and a place of great importance, the heart of the East Anglian kingdom. In doing so, Swithelm showed acceptance of the domination of his northern neighbours and Essex became linked into the North Sea culture of East Anglia rather than the Frankish culture of Kent. There is an irony in Swithelm's conversion because he only came to power after helping his brother, Swithfrith, kill their kinsman King Sigeberht—because he was too submissive in accepting the authority of a Christian bishop! Doubtless politics played a large part in these matters, then as now.

Of course, we may never know who owned the sword when it was lost. It might have been an East Anglian warlord, or one of King Swithelm's leading East Saxon warriors - or even the king himself?

From Councillor Lewis Barber

ince my last update, I continue to work on the communities' priorities with Cllr Chapman and the Parish Councils.

I appreciate this is a difficult time for many households with the rising cost of living. That is why Essex County Council has support structures in place to assist with any households struggling, as well as investing in tackling some of the underlying causes of hardship in our communities. If you do need assistance, touch please do get in on Cllr.lewis.barber@essex.gov.uk

We are progressing on improving safety to/from Boxted primary school. My understanding is that some households in Boxted who should have received a copy of the leaflet through the post have yet to do so. If that is yourself and you would like a copy, please let me know on cllr.lewis.barber@essex.gov.uk and I will get a copy to you. We are currently awaiting the results from Highways of a study of the area. Once we have that and we have considered the consultation responses, we will be able to determine the next steps.

I have made a contribution of £2,000 from my locality budget towards proposals to improve the road safety and pedestrian, cycle and equestrian access between the villages of north Colchester and north Colchester itself, such as Northern Gateway. The cost of the initial scheme will be £10,500, for which Highways will look at preparing proposals to tackle the above issues for consultation with the community. I am pleased to confirm that on top of my locality budget contribution, I have secured £5,000 from the Local Highways Panel and now will be seeking the balance to get this important project going. At the time of writing, I am liaising with local Parish Councils and Colchester Borough Council to do so.

n Langham, we have worked with L the Parish Council to review the results of the traffic survey. Following this, I have submitted an application to the Local Highway Panel to consider village gateways and rumble strips at the approach to Park Lane junction and on Birchwood Road on the approach to Wick Road junction. I'd welcome your thoughts on this ahead of a formal consultation. I am also working with the Parish Council on the installation of speed indicator devices to help reduce speeds. Over the coming weeks, there will be speed surveys in various locations across Boxted and Langham as we measure traffic flows and speeds. This follows on from discussions about how to improve safety traffic and management. We will share the updates and possible solutions for consultation and discussion once we have them.

I n Boxted, I have objected to the proposals for housing on the garage site unless they resolve the parking issues that are likely to arise. At the time of print, I am awaiting the outcome of this application, although Highways have objected to it. Similarly, we are also awaiting news on the application for Boxted Bridge, for which I have made my concerns firmly known.

I am pleased to see the investment secured in Severalls Lane has taken place. This is welcome and overdue and I made it a priority road for me to obtain the resources for repairs once elected. We are still awaiting the outcome of the option study from National Highways as to the future of the A12 bridge. I am continuing to push for this matter to be resolved as soon as possible and will share the outcome for views once received.

I also appreciate the frustration that can occur when other Highways issues, including flooding, are not dealt with as quickly as we like. That is why at our recent budget meeting I voted for an additional financial contribution to Highways to assist and to ensure rural Highways get a fair deal. We only have a finite budget but please do let me know of any issues and I will do my best to secure the money for repairs/ action. There is also a Property Flood Resilience Grant for up to £8,000 per property that the County Council provides to help address flooding problems.



On rural crime, I am pleased to see that the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner Roger Hirst is consulting on a rural crime strategy. I will be working to ensure the views of the communities I represent are fed into this and I'd welcome any views you have on rural crime. Roger has been hosting public workshops on the strategy and I have requested for a session to be held in the area.

CC is currently working on its Linext stage of its new bus strategy. Myself and ECC more widely is committed the promotion of to sustainable transport and improvements in rural bus services. Please do let me know any views you have and I will ensure the Councillor in charge of bus services is aware. We also continue to monitor and put pressure on the relevant authorities to ensure that Trinity School's permanent date does not slip any further

beyond the now planned September 2023, which in turn will ensure that there are suitable local secondary school places for our local communities as the school expands.

Throughout the month, we send out local information to our email newsletter. If you would like to subscribe, please do let me know.

Finally, the situation in Ukraine remains troubling and distressing. The support from the community has been inspiring to see in these difficult times. I am receiving regular updates on this issue and Essex County Council has a website with information on how you can help here:
