

# Welcome to the July Newsletter.

The Platinum Jubilee weekend of celebrations seems a distant memory now, but it is encouraging to report that they were a great success across both parishes and all four days of the Jubilee Weekend.

The sight of the Battle of Britain Flight and the Red Arrows tracking the A12 down towards London was most impressive then running in from the garden to the television to see the same aircraft passing over The Mall in London just a few minutes later.

Charlotte Parker was at the centre of Langham's celebrations and has provided some personal recollections and expressions of gratitude to those who participated — it's all here in the middle of this issue.

One of the lasting benefits of the weekend was the planting and dedication of a Jubilee Oak to stand beside the Coronation tree, planted nearly three quarters of a century before. The species chosen is *'Quercus robur Fastigiata'* which will one day be an impressive 66 feet (20 metres) tall, although it is not a fast-growing type so do not expect to see it looking quite so impressive any time soon.

happily, planned ess the ▲National Grid Pylon Scheme has exercised a good many minds of late and it is fair to say that resistance and strength of feeling are growing across all the eastern counties. With all the recent Jubilee-based emphasis on our national heritage and values, I wonder what legacy we are leaving to the people of the 22nd century by erecting these rows of steel titans? The long-term effects of short-term planning will be with us for decades to come, so it would be a good idea to try to get it right while we still can.

# Boxted Parish Council Report

# June 2022

The most controversial topic discussed at the meeting is the planned deployment of 400kV cables carried by 50m high pylons across East Anglia to take electricity generated from two offshore wind farms in the North Sea through East Anglia down to Tilbury.

These pylons will come along the southern end of Boxted. The proposal is to cable underground through the Dedham Vale AONB where is passes Stratford St Mary, but all other areas will get large overground pylons. This initial consultation closes on June 16<sup>th</sup> and is being run by UK Power Networks (responsible for the Nation Grid). There are environmental concerns, health concerns as well as concerns about disrupting the views.

To have your say you can complete the projects feedback form BUT people consider the form to be very leading, you might prefer to email the project directly via *EastAngliaGREEN@nationalgrid.com* Please copy in our MP as his is the only level of influence there is. Sir Bernard Jenkin, MP for North Essex, at

*bernard.jenkin.mp@parliament.uk.* Colchester Borough Council would also like sight of objections so you can send your thoughts to *planning.services@colchester.gov.uk*.

There is an action group that provides useful information and is also running a petition, see *www.pylonseastanglia.co.uk/* 

and a corresponding Facebook group (search for Essex Suffolk Norfolk Pylons).

Please do talk to your neighbours and friends to make sure everyone is aware of this project and has an opportunity to comment. The community groups think there is a better way to deliver this project by tracking the cables along the seabed to a point closer to Tilbury rather than march across the whole of East Anglia.

Colchester Borough Council has money that was contracted for

spending on the **Community Hub and the Recreation Ground**. New play equipment was bought and the access to the overflow parking area was improved, and the outdoor gym equipment was installed. We are hopefully reaching the point where we know what it will cost to update the community hub building. This will cost more than we have so we have applied to the **Football Foundation** for a grant to cover the shortfall.

he improvements include larger L kitchen space for the café, with access that includes both steps and a ramp, the flooring will be replaced and a bifold doors to the patio area. We should be able to create two officials' rooms for the various sports matches and improve the toilet and showers. The integral garage will be converted to a small committee room and kitchenette which could be bookable by residents. An English Oak tree has been donated by Colchester Borough Council as part of the Platinum Jubilee year which the volunteer **Biodiversity** Group have planted on the Village Green at Boxted Cross. We aim to get a plaque made up showing the Latin



(Linnaean) name, common name, date planted and referencing the Jubilee.

e hope you found time to enjoy the jubilee event at the Village Hall and Recreation Ground.

Thank you to the volunteer group that put in the hard work. It is a lot of effort and stress for those involved but we very much appreciate it.

The **Boxted 10k event** runs in June and you might have seen volunteers tackling some of the more overgrown public footpaths and bridleways.

# Langham Parish Council Report

# April to June 2022

he last three months have been a time of significant personnel changes for the Council, but the good news after this period of uncertainty is that we now have a full complement of seven Councillors on board and ready to move forwards with a busy agenda over the coming months.

We have recently said goodbye to Tony Emms and Ian Mansel-Thomas and we thank them for their time and contributions during their tenures. We have recently said hello to three new co-opted Councillors: Annette Thorpe, Lisa Ogawa and Peter Freeman.

At the Annual Parish Council Meeting on 18th May, Martin Bottwood re-elected was as Chairman, Annette Thorpe was as Vice-Chairman, elected and Committee memberships were agreed for the year ahead.

At the Annual Parish Assembly earlier the same evening, the East Anglian "GREEN" pylon project was understandably the subject of most concern and discussion among the Since that meeting participants. meeting, the Parish Council have prepared а position statement objecting to the current proposals and the lack of transparency in the decision-making process leading up to them. The full position statement can be found on our website, and has also been used as the basis for our formal National Grid. responses to Colchester Borough Council and our MP Sir Bernard Jenkin.

Following on from the autumn 2021 Village Traffic Survey, we are actively progressing the acquisition of a mobile Speed Indication Device that can be moved around between three selected sites on Wick Road, School Road and Moor Road (to supplement the existing fixed VAS on Park Lane). Quotes have been received from equipment suppliers, and we are currently seeking the necessary approvals from Essex Highways to progress with the installation and commissioning. Following on from the 2021 Village Survey, Amenities and the subsequent decision to upgrade the Children's Playground Area on the Recreation Ground, we have recently received updated quotes from several potential equipment suppliers. In parallel, we also actively are investigating a substantial potential grant from the Enovert Community Trust. which could enable an increase in the achievable scope of the playground expansion; and/or could allow for the release of some currently earmarked LPC reserves to other community projects instead. Barring any unforeseen problems, our aim is to proceed with the Playground upgrade work during this autumn.

Vistry Homes are now building at pace on their development site on School Road, under the partial discharge of planning condition 21 concerning sewerage capacity at the Langham WRC. They are allowed to build only 23 of the 46 homes at present, pending resolution of the sewerage capacity concerns at the WRC. We are currently chasing Anglian Water for an update on their flow monitoring program and are



also looking to schedule a follow up meeting with Sir Bernard Jenkin at the Langham Community Centre.

Langham Parish Council is delighted hosted and financially have to supported the recent program of Platinum Jubilee celebrations held between 2nd and 5th June. These village celebrations could not have happened without the support of a very large team of people. Elsewhere in this month's Parish Newsletter you can find a two-page Jubilee report which includes a roll-call of the all the fabulous volunteers who helped to make the events such a great success for the village. Thank you!

Plans to reinstate the much-missed Langham Annual Bonfire Night are coming along nicely, with the event date now confirmed as Saturday 5th November. So please do 'save the date' now for another memorable village event. Further details to follow in due course!

# BOXTED HISTORY GROUP

t the group's May meeting, Jef Page gave an informative talk

on the life and times of American president Franklin D. Roosevelt (FDK). who served three consecutive terms as president, dealing with the challenges of the Great Depression, mass unemployment and World War Two, along with failing health and a troubled home life. He met these with ambitious programmes of civil engineering (such as the Tennessee Valley Project to control flooding and generate electricity), conservation projects (planting over 200 million trees) - all to provide work.

On the social side, he introduced the Social Security Act which provided limited aid for the poor and age=related pensions. He was also the first president to use the latest technology to speak directly to the general public: radio.

Probably his greatest challenge was when WWII started and Churchill asked for material aid—at this time, America was deeply divided as to whether to get involved in what was then seen as a European conflict. Roosevelt realised that the war could well engulf the whole world, so "Lend -Lease" was introduced as a compromise.

Everything changed in 1941 when Japan attacked Pearl Harbour and the USA entered the war but, to his credit, Roosevelt still regarded the war in Europe as the number-one priority. Churchill in return pledged Britain's support in the war against Japan.

Having suffered deteriorating health for a number of years, FDR died in 1945 aged 63.

# Biodiversity & Sustainability Working Group

ello, and welcome to the June/July update from the Biodiversity and Sustainability working group. In May the group revived the concept of the Village Walk with 17 residents attending for an approximately 3 mile stroll around the village ending with refreshments at the Hub. This was deemed a popular idea and residents were happy to see it return, as such the group will now take this forward. The next walk on the 25th of June may have passed by the time you read this update, but thereafter the future walks shall be on Saturdays: 23rd July, 20th August, 24th September, 22nd October. Each time starting at 10am from the Village Hall carpark, Cage Lane. All welcome.

Much work has been done on the topic of **Biodiversity**, as mentioned in our previous update with regards to the Village Green. In order to also address our interests in Sustainability, the group is looking to host periodic, perhaps monthly, *"Reuse, Recycle, Rehome"* events on a Saturday. Following the success of similar projects in some local village communities we consider this to be a great way to reduce landfill and also to reduce unnecessary purchases. We would like to encourage residents to place items they wish to offer free of charge outside their properties on a certain Saturday each month from 10am. This could be bric-àbrac, toys, books, plants, fruit and veg as a few examples. Please clear offerings away by mid-afternoon to ensure our village remains tidy. Hopefully we will see crockery cherished by a new owner, old vinyl bringing music to new ears, toys and games enjoyed again and old football boots ready to be brushed off for the next season.

 $\boldsymbol{n}$  May the parish received a Jubilee Oak Tree from Colchester Borough council, for which we are very grateful to the Mayor of Colchester for what is a quite superb specimen of a tree. Expecting initially to receive a 3-foot-tall sapling, like many villages have planted this year, we were quite surprised instead to receive a quite substantial 4m tall tree that required machinery to plant. The Boxted Jubilee Oak has now been planted, pride of place, at the front of the Village Green and a short opening ceremony was held on the 4th of June to commemorate its planting (pictured). It has been agreed that a small plaque shall be arranged to record this event and identify the tree. The species of Oak chosen was 'Quercus robur Fastigiata', better known as the Cypress Oak. This Oak is a tall columnar shaped tree, which suited the space requirements for the green. Additionally this species of Oak holds its autumnal leaves long into winter providing good cover for birds and other wildlife. Fully grown it could be expected to

grow up to 20m heigh, but only 3-5m in width.

The group would like to commend and congratulate the hard work and effort of the **Boxted Runners' volunteers** in clearing the footpaths for the Boxted 10k in June. Their hard work will set a good baseline for us to commence our footpath monitoring and maintenance in the coming months as we formulate how best to approach this work and write to landowners to gauge their interests and request permissions.

There has been considerable positive public response to the clearing of some of the most heavily vegetated footpaths and this positive feedback encourages us to press on to ensure all of Boxted's many wonderful **PROW**s are monitored and maintained for all to enjoy.
