now, the Good Neighbours scheme offers help to those in the community by a team of dedicated local residents who simply want to help others in their community in any way they can.

Established by the local Churches of St Peter's and St Mary's, the team comprises 35+ volunteers, 10 of whom answer the telephone (see numbers opposite), between 8am and 7pm weekdays. All our volunteers are DBS checked and operate under Government and the Church guidelines.

Following a reduction in use over COVID we wish to revitalise the scheme. To this end we are keen to expand what we offer within the guidelines, to widen our audience and appeal for new volunteers.

Currently we offer a transportation service (to and from medical appointments), a prescription collection service and a befriending service for those might want a bit of company. There is no charge for these services but donations towards expenses are appreciated but by no means expected. We are

considering offering a shopping service or collecting a click-and-collect order. However, we would like to hear from you about what additional services you might require. For instance, do you require help with changing a light bulb, filling a form, sending emails or shopping online, etc? # BOXTEO HISTORY GROUP

t September's meeting there was a change from the usual format when the careers of two local entertainers and the history of a very popular TV programme in which they appeared were reviewed. David Webb and his twin brother came from the Manningtree area but forged a career nationally as a successful 'song and dance' performers. In the first part of the evening, David performed, with a little audience participation, some of the wellknown songs from their early days in the mid-/late sixties. At that time a TV company was considering making a series of comedy programmes located at a fictitious holiday camp, highlighting the antics of holidaymakers and staff during the summer holiday season. Warners' Holiday Camp at Dovercourt was chosen as the venue and when the talented cast (including the Webb twins) had been selected, Hi-De-Hi was

born. It was a huge success running for several years until holidays in the U.K. were largely replaced by cheap flights and package holidays abroad. David recalled many humorous incidents that occurred on and off screen, and proved he could still get into his 'Yellow Coat' —a definite crib on Butlins's famous 'Red Coats'.

It is hard to believe that the programme ended and Warners closed about 40 years ago, and yet so many local people still have fond memories of what was a unique piece of social history.

# SESAW NEWS

hat silly chihuahua gave me the best laugh I've had in ages! He was boasting about

'writing' Kenny's SESAW News since 2012. That's a decade to you and me – but he never admits to being more than eight years old! He can't even get up on time since the clocks went back so here's my cat's eye view of our news, starting with our first Christmas Fair since 2019.

Our volunteers have organised lots of gifts, crafts and bargains plus Jeanette's Terrific Tombola and refreshments served all day. Open 10am to 3pm on Sunday 20th at the Old School, Long Melford, CO10 9DX.

SESAW takes in not only domestic animals but also wildlife casualties including sick or injured hedgehogs found wandering during the day. This year the prolonged dry weather delayed their release into supported sites so two hedgehogs passed the time by helping increase their numbers to eight! All are now living in suitable areas where our volunteers oversee their welfare.

edgehogs numbers are falling but humans can help by supplying drinking water and cat or dog food to eat, never bread and milk. They need gaps under fences to move between gardens and a pile of leaves and twigs to hide under please check for 'Spike' before you build a bonfire.



The British Hedgehog Preservation Society (www.britishhedgehogs.org.uk) and People's Trust for Endangered Species (www.ptes.org) provide very detailed help and advice on what you can do.

# Boxted Wildlife

he Boxted Wildlife group are continuing to deliver our B4
Project (Boxted Birds, Bees and Bugs) which is funded by the Dedham Vale Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty Sustainable Development Fund.

We are incredibly fortunate as a village to be situated right on the border of the Dedham Vale AONB and to experience the natural beauty and diversity of wildlife that comes with it. Our aim as a group is to bring that wildlife into our village and to continue to make Boxted just as beautiful and wildlife friendly as the rest of the AONB.

As part of this project, in October we ran our first Wildlife Activity Day, at the time of writing the event has not yet happened, but fingers are crossed for pleasant Autumnal weather, and we are looking forward to meeting with all of you who might be keen to learn more about wildlife in Boxted and how you can help. We'll update you on how the event went in the December edition of this newsletter or keep in touch with us on facebook (facebook.com/ BoxtedWildlife). The next event in our catalogue of B4 activities will be a talk and presentation given by Dr Christopher Gibson. Dr Gibson is a local ecologist and conservationist, living in Wivenhoe and has been heavily involved in their "Wildflower Verges" project which was very much an inspiration for Boxted Wildlife. Chris is well published and well versed in presenting and speaking about his passions. He will be coming to Boxted on Tuesday, November 29th to present an illustrated talk on the subject of "Gardening for Wildlife". The talk will be held at the British Legion Club, on Straight Road. Doors open 6:30pm, talk to start at 7:30pm.

In October, volunteers from the group mowed, trimmed, weeded, and spruced up the Village Green as part of an end of season tidy up in readiness for the autumn and winter. There are different theories on how to manage wildflower meadows. As this was the first year of growth for our newly rejuvenated green, all tall grass areas had been left long in the wildflower zones until late autumn to ensure all plants had set and dropped seed before cutting. This also provided a great environment for wildlife to shelter during the severe heat of the summer, close inspection of the long grasses revealed moisture and green growth at the base, in the shade of the longer grass. In October we then cut all areas where bulbs have been planted, generally the swathes around the outer trees, to encourage the growth of the bulbs in late winter. The main wildflower patches in the centre of the green will be left long and uncut over the winter months to offer a habitat for hibernating insects and invertebrates.

The wooden circular bench around the central oak tree was removed in October by the Parish Council in readiness for a wrought iron circular seat in memorial to Colonel Jeremy Carter which, if not installed by the time of publication, will be very soon.

# Langham Parish Council Report – October 2022

e are delighted to report that our plans for a major upgrade to the Children's Play Area have reached an exciting stage. Following on from a detailed competitive tender exercise, a preferred supplier has now been chosen. Subject to satisfactory completion of final contract details, we hope to have the project delivered in Jan/Feb 2023. The revamped play area will include a large new "centrepiece" within an enlarged and refreshed fenced playground area. The funding will come from Parish Council

reserves and a significant grant provision from a local Community Trust. It is also anticipated that developer contributions, from the Vistry/Linden Homes development, will provide another significant funding stream.

We are pleased to report that Sir Bernard Jenkin has agreed to attend a follow-up meeting with **Anglian Water** on Friday 18th November, to review ongoing worries about lack of sewerage capacity within the village. The meeting will be held in the Langham Community

Centre, starting at 10am. We are most grateful for the concern shown both by our MP and our County Councillor, Lewis Barber, in trying to address the ongoing issues and risks associated with the inexorable and premature delivery of CBC's Local Housing Plan within the village. We hope to see a good turnout on the day so that our elected representatives are left in no doubt about the level of residents' concerns.

Friday 7th October saw the official unveiling of a Blue Plaque commemorating the life and achievements of **Dr Mary Edith Pechey**, who was born in Langham that day in 1845.

The ceremony was pleasingly well attended. Thanks are due to the Vice-Lord Lieutenant of Essex, Roy Clare,
