Dedham Vale Society

The Dedham Vale Society was formed in 1938 to protect the heritage of the Dedham Vale and its villages.

The River Stour valley, the setting for many of the paintings by renowned artist John Constable, was designated the Dedham Vale Area of Natural Beauty (AONB) by the Countryside Commission in 1969. The Vale stretches for nearly 14 miles on either side of the river, from Manningtree in the east to Wormingford in the west. However, its official status as an AONB does not protect it from the threat of development, both from housing and commerce, traffic and noise and, more recently, light pollution. Despite the best efforts of highway engineers to install more energyefficient road-lighting systems, the night-sky is disappearing.

Over the years campaigns have been fought with a great deal of success. The water and electricitygenerating companies, building



developers and even the Civil Aviation Authority have all been persuaded to amend or withdraw their plans in order to protect the fabric of this important AONB. Our work today is as vital as ever.

Langham Parish Council Report September 2022 — A Reply

was a tad surprised to see myself described simply as 'The Ward Councillor' in last month's Parish Council Report; there are in fact three of us and in my forty years as a councillor I have never sought anonymity for my actions. I attended the Planning Committee referred to as a member of that Committee appointed to make decisions on the agenda before us.

Primarily I would like to explain my position on the issue of the Water Recycling Centre (WRC) in Langham as I have acted consistently since being elected in 2016 for the area that included Langham. When an Application for housing at Boxted Cross first appeared I worked with the Council's Planners to resolve the issue of 'sewerage capacity' impacting on Langham WRC from that Application. Eventually I supported what we thought would work, which was to say that the houses could not be occupied until the capacity at the WRC had increased. This, unfortunately, was not a successful position to adopt. Therefore, when what is now the Vintry site was first mooted, I continued to engage with the planners

to resolve this issue. The condition

that there could be **no building until** the capacity was increased was proposed; I shared concerns that this too may be unlikely to succeed but the Planners believed it would work and developers would respect it. I, therefore, supported that condition then and the developers have, in fact, accepted it. All this was outlined clearly by the senior planning officer at the Committee meeting and endorsed by me during that meeting.

It is extremely difficult for any planning authority to respond to residents' concerns when statutory bodies, such as Anglian Water, do not raise an objection to an Application and this Condition is, I believe, clearly the best way forward. The worst-case scenario would surely have been if the Application had been refused and the Applicant won a subsequent Appeal without any Condition regarding the WRC.

I believe the decision with a strong Condition that 'no dwelling shall be occupied until the foul water strategy has been carried out' was the correct decision for Langham and Boxted.

Group? Officially we are the Boxted Biodiversity and Sustainability Group that was formed in 2021. We've changed name but not our ambition to make Boxted a greener, friendlier and healthier place for all species, be it birds, bees, bugs and even humans!

In the summer the **Boxted Wildlife** Group successfully applied for grant funding from the Dedham Vale Area of **Outstanding Natural Beauty Sustainable**

Development Fund, so that we may expand upon our ambitions to enhance public knowledge of the presence and importance of Bird, Bee and Bug species in and around Boxted, and to promote monitoring, feeding and nurturing of these. We are calling it the "B4 Project" (Boxted, Birds, Bees and Bugs Project). We are very grateful to have received this funding that provides great support to our voluntary group in order to proceed with this project.

Over the coming months we will be hosting a series of workshops and public activity sessions to encourage residents to learn about and engage with the work of the group, as well as numerous activities for children to also get involved. On the newly re-established Village Green we

ho are the Boxted Wildlife will be installing a number of Wildlife Show -Homes, consisting of bird boxes, bat boxes, bug and bee hotels, Stag Beetle Pyramids and even Hedgehog homes. These will demonstrate how it is possible to make welcoming homes for our neighbouring wildlife. We'll also be giving away bird feed and bird feeders to encourage the feeding of threatened species over the barren winter months.

> We also plan to host talks and presentations on topics of wildlife preservation and the importance of our natural environment as well as to hear from those with considerable knowledge about the wonderful surroundings that we are fortunate to call Boxted.

> The first of these events will be on Sunday the 23rd October from 10am until 12pm on the Village Green, where we will showcase a number of different Bird, Bee and Bug homes that can easily be built or purchased by anyone to make their garden, or whatever space they have more welcoming to all species. In addition, there will be a nature trail featuring a quiz/treasure hunt for children to take part in with refreshments available.

BOXTED HISTORY GROUP

he group's second summer visit was to Christchurch Mansion in Ipswich, a Grade I listed building which is the 'jewel in the crown' among the town's many historic buildings. Located in what is now Christchurch Park and originally built on the site of the 12th century St. Augustine's Holy Trinity priory. The priory was disbanded by Henry VIII in his Dissolution of the Monasteries, and the estate was seized by the Crown. In 1545 it was sold to the Withypoll family and three years later Edmund Withypoll built the fine Tudor brick mansion we see today. When built, the mansion was just outside the town wall, giving us an idea of how it has grown and

its centre moved away north from the original dockside settlement. A tour of the mansion reveals the interesting scars of domestic life and changes to the original design over 500 years.

The mansion is now also home to one of the world's most important collections of the work of John Constable and records his life in Suffolk.

MEDIEVAL PENDANT FOVNO IN BOXTED

n Saturday 29th September 2018, Trish Ostrowski was out in Boxted using her metal-detector when she happened upon a remarkable find: a gold seal matrix pendant of oval form with a box-style setting and suspension loop to the reverse.

The pendant is set with a mottled white-black chalcedony intaglio engraved with a naturalistically modelled eagle facing left, with its wings spread. It dates to the 13th-14th century A.D.

The use of mottled stone for an intaglio is quite unusual since the pattern makes it difficult for an observer to see the details of the design. This must have been a deliberate measure to keep the seal's motif secret.

The border bears the Latin legend '+ SIGNVM AMORIS:SA:I' in Lombardic capitals within a beaded rim. Malcolm Jones (British Museum) suggests that *SA* might be a contraction of the word *SANCTI* ('saint' or 'holy'). This would therefore translate to '*A token/sign of sacred/holy love'*. However, John Cherry notes



that the semi-colon in the inscription between the SA and the I (SA : I) is significant, particularly if the attribution of the eagle to St John is correct, and could be a contraction of *Iohanni*...The full inscription would therefore translate to 'A sign (or token) of the love of St John'. However, this is not conclusive'.

The find was reported to the Finds Liaison Officer of the Portable Antiquities Scheme (PAS) and was recorded under reference number WREX-ADFAB9. It was also mentioned in an article in *Treasure Hunting Magazine* in 2019. The Churches of ST Mary's Langham and St Peter's Boxted
