t the January meeting of the Parish Council the Council. as the sole Trustee of the **Boxted** Village Hall confirmed that hire fees for the Hall would remain the same for 2023/24. We are lucky to still be benefiting from a fixed price contract for electricity and the trustees felt that the increased running costs could be absorbed. 
The Hub café should be open now after the refurbishment. The old wool carpet has been replaced by a nice clean floor, there are fantastic large bi-fold windows on to the patio and field and Doug has a bigger kitchen space in which to work. There is a large disabled toilet and a new improved ramp and access. The coffee is still a lovely Italian blend and the cakes full of delicious calories. For those on the post-Christmas diets Doug usually has a low-cal option on the menu.

The sports side **changing rooms** have also had a major refurb. We have individual showers, new toilets, two officials' rooms to cater for female and male officials. The old, dilapidated garage has been converted into a small meeting room which can be hired out.

Colchester Borough Council are running pop up sessions in the Café in January, February and March where advice will be available on helping with the cost-of-living pressures.

The council has agreed its budget for the forthcoming year which will see an increase in the amount of your council tax bill that comes to the parish council increase by £8.77 per year for the average Band D household. This budget manages the prices increases we face but also allows for an additional dog waste bin on a public footpath and also to establish a garden area with petanque/ table tennis between Little Owls and the Community Hub.

Cllr Barber reported that First buses should have in place their improvements to the Boxted bus service. It is

## Langham Parish Council Report - Nov. 2022- Jan. 2023

The next few years will see some significant changes in our village as it expands to accommodate the three major new housing developments that were approved in Colchester City Council's Local Plan for 2017-2033. This growth brings both opportunities and challenges for our local community, and your Parish Council will work hard to try and make the best of the new opportunities whilst seeking to minimise any difficulties and growing pains that may arise.

An early milestone on this journey was reached just before Christmas,

when the first home on the new School Road development was occupied, thereby triggering Colchester City Council to request payment of S106 contributions from the developer, Vistry Homes. Langham Parish Council will now work closely with the City Council to release this funding against specific improvement projects, in line with the resident priorities expressed through the 2021 Village Amenities Survey.

It is really important that new residents are welcomed warmly into the village and invited to get involved in our local community, particularly in view of the ageing profile of the existing village population! For many years, volunteers within the Community Shop have provided Welcome Packs to new residents, which is a great initiative. Cllr Ogawa has recently been liaising with the Shop to explore new ideas for further development of the Welcome Packs, including Parish Council funding of the printing costs.

In November, the return of the Langham Fireworks Display was (according to 99% of the feedback received!) a great success after a three year hiatus. Cllr Palmer did a grand job in assembling and coordinating a wonderful team of volunteers to relaunch the event. The actual fireworks display was perhaps the most impressive ever, and the bar and food vans did a roaring trade which helped raise an overall event profit of about £7k for use by the Parish Council to support Community projects.

In January, we were delighted to receive Certificates of Merit from the **Essex Playing Fields Association.** A **Gold** for the playing fields, and a **Silver** for the children's playground. Hopefully we will receive an upgrade to Gold for the children's playground next year, after completion of the major expansion project which is now scheduled for completion this Spring! In other news, the very prominent green Gigaclear cabinet at the Moor Road/Park Lane junction is to be surrounded with young plants which Gigaclear have agreed to pay for this Spring. Over time this should provide nice screening.

Following on from the November public meeting with **Anglian Water**, our MP Sir Bernard Jenkin has written to the CEO of Anglian Water and will indeed now be meeting personally with him in the near future. In the meantime, we are continuing to apply pressure via multiple avenues to try to protect Langham from the risk of sewage overflows resulting from premature housing growth.

## BOXTED HISTORY GROUP

Ochester may be Britain's newest city but in Roman times it was their first city and for a time the capital of *Britannia*.

At the group's November meeting Patrick Denney revisited some of today's well-known sites including the temple to Claudius (beneath the present castle) and the Roman theatre in what is now known as the Dutch Quarter. He covered in detail the discoveries made since the sites were first excavated. It was usual for the Romans and more important Britons to live within the city walls, but they built their cemeteries and sports arenas outside.

The successful excavations within the walls gave the archivists the impetus to look for further sites outside. One of the first 'new' sites to be found was the Circus Arena just south of the city but further west in Stanway and even larger arena has been found—at present there are just five known circus arenas in Britain and Colchester has two! In the same area a number of cemeteries have been found containing the usual grave artefacts but also some board games never seen before. Now all the experts have to do is work out how to play them.

n many ways 2022 was a difficult and stressful year so in complete contrast to the usual format, December's meeting was more of a light-hearted social get-together. The success of the evening was down to Programme Secretary Derek Kirby who organised and compered the event which included a mini-historical quiz, amusing period songs and refreshments with a Christmas flavour.

he programme for 2023 is now available and promises ten interesting meetings in the village hall (including the usual refreshments) and two visits for only £15. Like most organisations, the membership of the History Group has declined and, to survive in the long term, it needs new members so please consider joining if you have any interest in history—I am sure you won't be disappointed. 


