Boxted Parish Council Report - February 2023

U r February meeting, we were a bit thin on the ground in terms of councillors and members of the public.

The council looked at the 6 planning applications and decided to comment where appropriate.

All **Boxted councillor positions** are up for election for a 4-year term with elections taking place with other local elections on the 4th of May.

Colchester City Council organise the elections and have a dedicated website page https://www.colchester.gov.uk/ elections/.

Voting rules have changed and voting in person will now require people to show Id. Details are on the Colchester website, but Id can be passport, driving licence (including provisional license), blue badge, certain concessionary travel cards, identity card with PASS mark (Proof of Age Standards Scheme), biometric immigration document, Defence identity card, certain national identity cards. You can also apply for a Voter Id card so don't be caught out and make sure you have the right identify information with you.

The final refurbishment tasks are

being completed and the sports side of the **Community Hub** will re-open to our sports clubs before this article is printed. On the sports side of the building we now have a small committee styled room which will be available for public hire when the clubs are not using it. It has lovely full length windows looking on to the field and we hope will be well utilised. If you are interested in hiring the space then please get in touch with our clerk, Karen, via *boxtedparisbcouncil@gmail.com*.

e hope to have an opening ceremony of our new facilities which will be attended by the **Football Foundation** as they contributed nearly £100,000 to the project.

Colchester Borough Council are running pop up sessions in the Community Hub Café on 28th February and the 14th and 28th March where advice will be available on helping with the **cost-of-living pressures**.

We also have *Coffee with Cops* in March and April in the Community Hub Café on the 2nd Thursday in the month – please go and say hi to them and I'm sure they can give good advice about minimising risk in and around your home.

We are still waiting to hear when Essex will be considering the Highways

application to replace the lovely historic bridge over the River Stour in the Dedham Vale AONB. The parish council fully supports the Save Our Bridge campaign which is trying hard to persuade Essex Highways to restore the bridge rather than replace it with a structure that is big enough to cope with 40 tonne traffic. The campaign group have raised funds to pay for planning specialists to make the arguments in planning-speak, to stand the best chance possible of saving the bridge.

By the time this newsletter arrives with you, contractors will have started work on the Recreation Ground Play Area expansion and upgrade, in the week commencing 20th February. We are delighted that we are able to do this in what is the 50th anniversary year of the original opening of the Langham Recreation Ground in 1973.

It is anticipated that the work should be completed by about mid-March, although there will of course be some weather dependency to this date. We look forward to re-opening the Play Area as soon as the exciting upgrade work is completed. During the course of the works, we would please request that access to the double gates near the Play Area is kept clear to allow works traffic access. Deliveries and working schedules will be kept to sensible hours to mitigate disruption to nearby residents.

Vistry Homes S106 Contributions

lowing first occupancy of homes L on the new housing development in December 2022, Vistry Homes have now their full contractual S106 paid contributions to Colchester City Council (CCC) in February 2023. These comprise substantial contributions towards 'Community Facilities' and 'Parks & Recreation'. Langham Parish Council will now work closely with CCC to draw down those funds against designated improvement projects within the village. The first drawdown will be towards the Play Area expansion project (which is being funded through a combination of External Grant, S106 funds and Parish Council Reserves).

East Anglia "Green" Pylons Project

During the last few weeks, Councillors have attended two Pylon information meetings: one in Stratford St Mary and one in Little Horkesley. These were well attended and very well organised by the Pylons East Anglia lobbying group. The Stratford St Mary Meeting was attended by local MP James Cartlidge. The situation is evolving rapidly, and the recent deferral of the Statutory Consultation from 2023 to 2024 may potentially represent a small victory in opening up a more genuinely open consultation about the various onshore and offshore options for upgrading the UK's power distribution network to meet rapidly growing future needs.

It has become clear, however, that there will need to be significant ramping up and broadening of the campaign if the Government is to be persuaded to take a more strategic and more offshore-centric approach. We are keen to offer our support and help to spread this message to Langham residents. As such we are actively exploring the possibility of hosting a Pylon information meeting in the Langham Community Centre in the Spring, and we hope to announce more details soon.

Appointments

S ince our last contribution to the parish magazine, we have had the holidays and the Strep A epidemic as well as the usual winter cold and vomiting viruses. These, along with the cost-of-living crisis has led to an increase in the prevalence of ill health (both mental and physical) amongst our patients and staff.

We have severe pressures on an already strained appointment system. We still offer both telephone and face to face appointments every day with our clinicians. To book please call the surgery from 0800hrs. The same day appointments are usually all booked by 0900hrs. Routine appointments can be booked up to 4 weeks in advance and lastly emergency appointments can be booked with a GP after suitable triage by the duty doctor.

There are extended access appointments every Saturday from 0900hrs to 1700hrs. These can be telephone or face to face. These appointments are not held at Ardleigh Surgery. We also provide telephone only appointments from 1830hrs to 2000hrs every day. All extended access appointments are prebookable, up to 4 weeks in advance for both GPs and Nurses. The *Daily Mail* has recently launched an app to show how your local GP surgery is performing using NHS digital data collected in November 2022. If you type, "How bad is my GP" into Google you should be able to access this national database. In November 2022 87% of our patients rated us as good, we offered 4592 appointments, 73% were face to face, 33% same day and 43% with a GP.

r Gladwin will be off for the next 3 months at least. Sister Harrison has retired, and we are in the process of recruiting a new advance nurse practitioner. We have a new staff member, Sam Taylor, she is a GP assistant. We have two new receptionists who replaced seasoned staff who left.

Compulsory Surgery Training Days:

The next compulsory Northeast Essex Surgery training afternoon will be on the 29th of March 2023. The surgery will be closed from 1230hrs and the dispensary from 1200hrs. Other dates are

Flu vaccinations are still available at the surgery for those over 50 years of age until the end of March 2023.

BOXTED HISTORY GROUP

t the first meeting of the New Year, the Group welcomed back local historian Pip Wright who recalled in the first person the "colourful" life of George Edward (Joe) Whistlecraft. He was born and lived most of his life in Suffolk, and was the second of several children. His father was registered as a farmworker but appeared to gain most of his income and food from poaching, and when Joe was only six years old was arrested and sentenced to one months' hard labour. As father aged, Joe and his elder brother took on the job of poaching for the family but with the start of WWI his brothers were enlisted leaving Joe, who failed the medical to carry on the "family business" alone.

He was arrested numerous times for being 'drunk and disorderly' but his first major crime was trying to burn down a neighbour's house following a dispute. He was arrested and tried on two occasions for committing a serious crime: firstly, for accidentally (?) shooting his father and secondly for shooting dead a gamekeeper. On both counts the cases were dismissed on the grounds of 'conflicting evidence'. During WWII he became an honest man at last as the poacher became a gamekeeper. He died at the age of 80 during which time he was arrested over a hundred times and served more than twenty years in jail.

Boxted Wildlife Group – Help 4 Hogs
