Langham Parish Council Report – March 2023

The **Children's Play Area** Upgrade has progressed well during March. When this Newsletter arrives, the Contractors will hopefully have left and the new Play Equipment will then be available for immediate use. A formal opening ceremony will follow, encompassing 50 years since the opening of the Recreation Ground.

The next major village project being addressed using developer contributions from the Vistry Homes development is the installation of a public **Multi-Use Games Court** on the Recreation Ground, adjacent to the existing tennis courts. Initial tender responses from seven potential contractors are currently being reviewed. This is a complex project, so it will take some time to finalise the specification and proceed to the construction phase.

Speaking of sports, the **All Stars children's cricket initiative** has been invited to come to Langham this

Spring, offering Friday evening sessions between 12th May & 30th June. Interested parents can read more (& register) via the News page of the Parish Council Website.

National Grid ESO will be conducting an Eastern Region transmission review in 2023. This is welcomed by the **Essex Suffolk Norfolk Pylons Action Group**, who are seeking a coordinated and integrated offshore Grid linking wind farms and interconnecting to offshore energy islands.

The Action Group, and others, have called repeatedly for a review since the exclusion of the East of England from the Holistic Network Design (HND) in 2022. Langham are actively involved in the co-ordination of a presentation to get key information out to local residents and adjoining parishes.

The situation is constantly evolving and regular presentations are crucial at this time.

Woodland Carbon Guarantee Scheme

Residents may have noticed lots of trees being planted in the village and wondered what it is all about. The planting has taken place under the **Woodland Carbon Guarantee Scheme**. This allows producers who produce carbon to offset it against carbon reducing schemes.

A year ago the landowner entered the area they were going to plant into a Government Woodland Carbon Guarantee National Auction and obtained a price that they could run with. At that point they successfully applied for a Forestry Commission Wood Creation Scheme and Carbon Set Off Scheme. This involved the following agencies:

Forestry Commission.

Natural England.

Environment Agency.

Local Authority Archaeology.

Boxted Parish Council.

There are approximately 8 acres being planted consisting of the following trees:



1877 Oak

1460 Hornbeam

1250 Lime

1200 Silver Birch

600 Cherry

400 Hazel

Plus a small number of Scots Pine and Douglas Fir.

The number and varieties are at the behest of the Forestry Commission. Carbon will start to be sold after approximately 5 years, increasing yearly.

Responsibility of maintaining woodland is the landowner's to the satisfaction of the Forestry Commission. It is a long term project but the local environment should benefit fairly quickly.

He is not here, He is risen!

April begins in a rather playful mood, with April Fools day. Be it on TV, radio or in the papers, over the year, there have been some rather clever April fools jokes played on us, the unsuspecting public. Who can forget Richard Dimbleby's report in 1957 on a particularly bountiful crop of spaghetti in Switzerland, due in part to the disappearance of the pesky spaghetti weevil. In 1977 *The Guardian*, had a play on typefaces, as it published a travel guide to the mysterious island grouping of San Serrife. The two islands, Upper Caisse and Lower Caisse, forming the shape of a semi-colon. And in 1976, Patrick Moore announced on Radio 2 that at 9.47am we would feel what he called the 'Jovian-Plutonian gravitational effect.' At that exact moment, the planets would alight and gravity on earth would get a tiny bit weaker, so if you jumped in the air at exactly the right moment, you would almost float.

Just over a week after we enjoy the fooling around of April Fool's Day, we will this year celebrate Easter Day. For the disciples on that first Easter morning, it must have felt like the women were trying to pull off the most elaborate April fools joke, running in to tell them that the stone that covered the entrance to Jesus's tomb had been rolled away and the body gone. Though Peter and John, run to the scene, they still can't quite understand what has happened.

Later that afternoon, two disciples on the road to Emmaus, walk along in utter despair. Although they have heard the testimony of the women, telling them about the empty tomb, and the angels who told them Jesus was alive, still they cannot believe it. It sounds like complete foolishness, it is so unbelievable. As they journey on, Jesus meets them in their place of unbelief and says 'How foolish you are, and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken! Did not the Christ have to suffer these things and then enter his glory?' and beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the scriptures concerning himself.

The testimony of the women, that first Easter morning, was not foolishness, it was not some elaborate hoax, what they had to report was real and has been the good news that has transformed the lives of millions of people ever since. And so this Easter time, we can with joy again declare, along with the angels 'He is not here – Jesus is not dead and in a tomb – He has risen! And through his resurrection, Jesus assures us of the promise of life everlasting. Alleluia. May God bless you this Easter time.

Firstly, I must apologise to everyone who came to the Group's last meeting expecting to learn about the Maldon Moot Hall.

Unfortunately, only a few days before the meeting, one of the speakers was taken into hospital but the remaining one—Mike Figg—offered to present an alternative talk entitled *Dodgy Scales and Delivering the Mail* which in the circumstances the Committee was pleased to accept. Apparently, Mike had always been interested in people's daily shopping habits and in turn the impact of any changes they made on the commercial face of a town's High Street. When he retired and moved to South Woodham Ferrers he made it a 'project' to research, document and photographically record these changes in his new home town. Using a selection of these photographs and historical town maps, it was interesting to see how individual shops had changed the items they sold or the services they provided, but also the location of the shopping centre

itself. Initially the shops were spread along a lengthy High Street, but when the railway arrived they slowly re-grouped around the station. Again, in more recent times, a new shopping mall was built and this time many shops left the town centre altogether. This is, of course, an ongoing trend and no doubt with the growing use of internet shopping the traditional shop will eventually disappear—or will it?

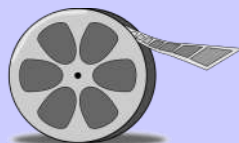
