#### Welcome to the November Newsletter.

As I take up my keyboard in the last days of October, the whole country has just been inundated by Storm Babet which has left floods and standing water over anything flat. Essex, of course, has fared rather badly for that reason although the Stour has not been quite as vicious as some other major waterways.

Our river's name means 'mighty, powerful' (like *stor* in Danish, although the name is certainly English). The modern word 'stir' - to drive, push or thrust—is from the same root. Before the introduction of water management facilities ('banks and ditches' to you and me) the river

may well have appeared much more like a torrent than it does at present . But is the name pronounced to rhyme with 'doer' or with 'power'? That depends on which side you live on—and where on the river's course. Generally the Essex name rhymes with 'doer' but in some villages the intrusive 'power"-rhymed form is now current—and a few miles further on the scheme is reversed with the Essex pronunciation found in Suffolk. This just shows that in former times, the river was more of a highway than a barrier.

## BOXTED HISTORY GROUP

orman Jacob's adventure began when he won £10,000 on a TV quiz show and he decided to blow it all on a holiday to South America. He talked to the History Group about his journey. From Heathrow he landed in Lima in Peru and headed off to the rainforest, staying in a jungle hut that he shared with a preying mantis. Then he moved to Cusco, the centre of the ancient Inca civilisation. There he saw a cathedral that was built shortly after the Spanish conquest of South America. The Spanish were there for gold and shipped back to their home country all that they could find, including the gold that lined the walls of Norman's hotel that had once been an antechamber of a temple. A series of earthquakes damaged more recent buildings but did not disturb the Inca structures. He travelled by train which stopped regularly to let travellers off to peruse the local markets that sold goods typical of the local culture before reaching a group of man-made

islands that pre-dated the Inca civilisation.

He then moved on to Buenos Aires in Argentina, a city with modern highways. He saw the Plaza de Mayer where the revolution began and which is still the centre of political activity. It contains the presidential palace from where Eva Peron gave speeches. She died in 1952 and the country went into mourning for two days. Three million people lined the route of her funeral procession.

After briefly visiting Uraguay, Norman travelled to Rio de Janeiro in Brazil where he went to the top of Suagarloaf mountain and also the huge statue of Christ the Redeemer. All in all Norman gave an entertaining and informative account of his travels.

## PROBUS CLUB OF COLCHESTER

Members met at the fairly modern club house of Colchester Rugby club on Wednesday 11th October. It was well attended with several ladies including three possible new members. After coffee and club business members enjoyed a very interesting talk and presentation delivered by Chris and Lois Pertee, both club members. The talk was titled - BRIDGES OF FRANCE-

Chris Pertee's background was a Professional Civil Engineer and he



and his wife are members of the Anglo French Society based in Colchester.

His first slide was that of Monet's garden and he explained that they had attempted to visit it on more than one occasion. From looking at the image it was clear it was well worth the visit.

The talk was in 3 parts: Historical Bridges, The Eiffel Period, and Modern Bridges.

He illustrated a number of Roman bridges and mentioned that it was the Romans who came up with the idea of the stone arch. These bridges were either a single stone arch or in some cases multi arched bridges crossing wider rivers or valleys.

He mentioned the collapse of the Malpassat dam. The engineers wished to open the sluice gates but were not permitted because of bridge construction down stream of the dam. The dam collapsed and this led to the deaths of 420 workers constructing a new bridge. The politicians did not want to stop construction of the new bridge.

#### The Eiffel period

The famous Eiffel tower was built between 1887 and 1889.

Eiffel also built the Gabarit Viaduct at Chaudef Aiguef

#### Modern Bridges

He then showed a number of slides of bridges built during the modern period. Such as the Modern Pegasus bridge that replaced the original which was shown in the film (The Longest Day)

Finally he showed a slide of the Millau bridge over the Tarn Valley

A very interesting talk which led to a number of questions from members.

## THEY LIVED IN LANGHAM

An occasional series by the Langham Heritage Group

1. Major General Richard Lucas Mullens CB, 1871-1952 *The Oaks*, c.1906 -1935

y 1907 the small Langham Oaks estate had been bought by Major Mullens, Adjutant of 2nd Dragoon Guards, then stationed at Colchester, Mullens had been born in Teddington, Middlesex, and was married to Leonore, née de Wette. They had four children, two of whom were baptised in Langham, in 1907 and 1908 respectively. After Eton and Sandhurst, Mullens had been commissioned in 1890 as Cornet in the 16th Lancers. He transferred to the 2nd Dragoon Guards, seeing action in the Second Boer War (1899-1902) as the regiment's Adjutant on Special Service.

He was severely wounded in the Leeuwkop action near Kimberley and twice Mentioned in Despatches. By the outbreak of the Great War, Mullens had been promoted to Lieutenant Colonel commanding 4th (Royal Irish) Dragoon Guards. He took his regiment to France with the British Expeditionary Force (BEF) in

August 1914; outside Mons, it was the very first unit of the BEF to exchange fire with the invading German forces. Mullens was soon promoted to command 2nd Cavalry Brigade and in May 1915 was badly 'gassed' but in October of that year was appointed Major General Commanding 1st Cavalry Division, remaining its highly-regarded and well-liked GOC for the rest of the war. He was Mentioned in Despatches a further seven times and




appointed Companion of the Bath (CB) in 1917. After the 1918 Armistice, his 1st Cavalry Division had the honour of leading the British Army into Germany. Mullens returned with the division to England in April 1919 and retired from the army in 1920.

By the time Mullens returned to Langham a considerable acreage had

been added to The Oaks estate. Somehow, despite his continuous service on the Western Front, the estate had expanded to include: most of the land north of School Road as far as the ridge on the further side of

Black Brook; land south of School Road, including Park Lane Farm; and land west of Moor Road. The house had been enlarged before the war by the addition of a north wing, the main entrance having been moved to the junction of the two structures. In the same period, a substantial garden room was added.

During his retirement, Mullens became a renowned breeder of Shorthorn cattle and Suffolk Punch horses. He was Gen & Mrs Mullens in the rose pergola, The Oaks c.1907

appointed a Justice of the Peace and was invited by the Langham Parish Council to be its chairman, a position he held for 15 years until he left Langham. During his very active chairmanship, he played a leading part in the erection of the War Memorial Gateway to the Primary School, of which he was a manager (governor). He was also instrumental in having the Village Hall erected in 1932 at the corner of Perry Lane and Wick Road. Jan Parker tells us ('Langham: When Yesterday was Today', 1991) that Mullens was a

sponsor of the 1st Langham Scout Group, the meetings of which were held in the gun room of The Oaks, the Scoutmaster being Mr Loch, the butler. The Langham Ladies Entertainment Committee was for some years presided over by Nadine Mullens, the General's daughter, and the Committee's annual summer fête was held in grounds of The Oaks\*.

Mullens had put a large part of The Oaks estate up for sale even before he retired from the army but most of it stayed unsold. More land, including Godfreys, Mount Pleasant and Sprike's Grove wood was sold in 1932 and three years later Mullens disposed of the remainder of the Oaks estate.

The Mullens left Langham in December 1935 to live at Devizes, Wiltshire, where in the Second World War Mullens served in the Wiltshire Home Guard. He died on 26th May 1952; his medals were sold by Spink in November 2006 for £4,000.

\*History was repeated in 1974-6, when the Langham Village Fête was hosted by the Homestead School in the grounds of The Oaks.

Gradually over the years Perrywood Garden Centre has grown to what

we see today. They grow all the bedding plants—about one million a year—which are now pricked out mechanically by a machine. In 2018 a Perrywood Garden Centre was opened in Sudbury. Both Centres have a lovely gift shop and restaurant

## Boxted Parish Council Report - October 2023

We have a full council in Boxted with all 9 positions filled via the May elections and the first meeting afterwards. We have new Councillors at Colchester acting for Boxted when Nigel Chapman took retirement after 40 years of council service. Thomas Rowe is our main representative. Lewis Barber continues to represent Boxted as part of his Constable Division at Essex County.

We have had a beautiful unique wrought iron bench installed around the central tree on the village green, courtesy of the Carter family. It represents the fruit orchards that existed until the late 80's and is in memory of Dennis and George Carter. We also hope to install an information board on the green telling the story of the land so that its history is kept in mind.

Lewis Barber is as frustrated as we are with the recent problems of A12 closure resulting in a gridlocked Colchester but also standing traffic on Cooks Hill! He wants National Highways to work with Essex and Colchester rather than issuing their closure plans with no opportunity to discuss impact and alternative options. The council continues to ask Trinity School to consider nominating Boxted St Peters Primary School as a direct feeder school. This would stop the clearly ridiculous position where children in Colchester travel past schools in Colchester to get to Trinity whilst Boxted children are driven past Trinity to get to other Colchester City schools. This is due to the 'as the crow flies' policy that Trinity have chosen to adopt. With future pressure on East Bergholt School expected with the new housing in Bergholt, we think the situation will get worse.

County Broadband came to a council meeting recently to explain that they would like to install a fast fibre in Boxted which would use the existing BT/Openreach pole and wire infrastructure to carry fibre cables direct to properties. If they reach a threshold of pre-orders then a new fibre cabinet would be installed and fibreto the property rolled out to

customers. Residents and businesses can email

mitchell.harriman@countybroadband.c o.uk and or use the County Broadband website to see the offered services. The council is not promoting County Broadband over any other company but making it known what was discussed at the council meeting.

Our formal opening ceremony of our refurbished Hub facilities will take place at the end of October which will be attended by the Football Foundation as they contributed nearly £100,000 to the project as well as Colchester City Council and the various sports groups in Boxted. Harpers café at the Hub will provide the refreshments.

The small committee styled room is available for public hire when the clubs are not using it. With a kitchenette for teas and coffees and free Wi-Fi – it is a good meeting room seating about 10 people. It has lovely full-length windows looking on to the field and we hope it will be well utilised. The fight to retain a repaired Boxted

Bridge over the River Stour is ongoing and the council continues to press Essex Highways to justify the current closure of the bridge to all traffic over and under the bridge. We saw the Sudbury to the Sea event severely curtailed as canoes and paddle boards were not able to traverse the river and no suitable portage had been established. We have studied the recent inspection report, which triggered the closure of the bridge, and it suggests that

repair options exist and recommends a feasibility study. We hope this will persuade Essex Highways to withdraw the full replacement planning application and conduct further investigation.
