### BOXTEO HISTORY GROUP

rsenic is known to most people as a lethal poison. What is less well-known is its usage in many other ways. For instance, it was used in small doses in Victorian times as a medicine for complaints such as neuralgia and skin disorders. Soap contained it and it was widely advertised under the heading Medicated Arsenic Complexion Soap. It was present in the dyes used in wallpaper production and children's clothing. It was even employed as an aphrodisiac. Arsenic was also fed to chickens to fatten them up, the dosage being administered until a month before the chickens were due to be killed. It was used in agriculture as a pesticide until it was replaced by DDT in the 1940's and it was not banned in America until the 1980's. It was manufactured on a huge scale, especially in Devon where one mine produced enough to kill 300 billion people.

It is in murders, however, that it is best known, being very effective and difficult to detect. The most prolific killer (as far as is known) was Mary Ann Cotton who murdered 21 people, including her own mother, 3 husbands and 11 children. Her

motive was to claim insurance money. She was arrested, found guilty and sentenced to hang. The most recent poisoner was Nasreen Shah who was imprisoned in 1953.

he most famous victim was Napoleon Bonaparte who claimed he was being poisoned by the British while held captive on Elba. It was argued that the dyes in the wallpaper were the source of his illness but some believe that a dosage was being administered by his doctor. Neil Dickenson talked to the Boxted History Group about *The Toxic Legacy of Arsenic*. The group meets on the third Wednesday of the month in the Village hall at 8.00pm.

### GROUP VISIT — Harwich Museum

n 21st June the Group met at the new Harwich Museum in the historic fortified dock and port. Exhibits in the collection on display include some flint handaxes, Bronze Age tools and a few Roman items, but the focus of interest is firmly on the town's post-medieval reputation as the birthplace of the ship *Mayflower* which took the Pilgrim Fathers to the New World in the 16th century and on the role the town played in welcoming the *Kindertransport*—mainly Jewish refugee children escaping the persecution of Nazi Germany.

The old *Sealink* ferry crossing to Hook of Holland is represented by ship models and photographs and - more surprisingly—the nearby Dovercourt Caravan Park where the *Hi-De—Hi* TV show was filmed (as we knew from previous talks given to the group by a cast member).

A walking tour of the historic central area included the house of Christopher Jones who was the master of the Mayflower, some beautiful Tudor and later houses in the backstreets, the medieval church which suffered extensive remodelling in Victorian times and the famous *Electric Cinema*, which is still in use (and our visit coincided with a screening already in progress —whoops!).

The Museum— located in the port area and opposite Harwich Town railway station—is the project of a local businessman who is trying to raise the profile of the town. We enjoyed light refreshments in the *Lighthouse Tea Bar* and were tempted by the quaint pub *The Alma* which has a good reputation for local beers and seafood. The visit and tour filled a very pleasant couple of hours on a warm midsummer afternoon.

Rape was defined in U.K. law in 1956 but there have been changes since. 95000 women and 12000 men are raped in England and Wales every year but figures of rape on the elderly are not recorded

nationally. Ninety per cent of rape victims know the perpetrator before the offence. The average time for a court case is two and a half years. This talk was very interesting and brought home what is happening in our world today.
