Whilst the subject matter was at times hard to hear all of the speakers highlighted that there is still work to do and indeed the important of the collective voice of women in organisations like the WI.

We hope that this has provided some food for thought about the group and what we do and stand for both locally and nationally. *Please do come along and join us at one of our meetings*.

BOXTEO HISTORY GROUP

ady Alice de Bryene is a little-known figure. She was born in about 1386 and lived until she was roughly 75 years old - a good age for those times. She was a wealthy land owner who lived at the long demolished Acton Hall near Sudbury. She owned land in different parts of the country, including 3,000 acres in Suffolk.

She was born in turbulent times and lived through the reign of four kings, the plague, the peasants' revolt and the battle of Agincourt. Since the Norman Conquest French had been the language of the upper classes but now English came into its own.

Girls were married off very young usually to a much older man for status and security and Alice was no exception. She married well. Because husbands were so much older than their wives they tended to die first. The women then normally remarried presumably someone more suited to them. Alice never remarried because she had such strong family connections of great wealth and status that she needed no protection.

The house that Alice lived in probably consisted of one large hall with a kitchen attached. The hall was where everyone (including servants and visitors) ate and slept. It was used for living in, social gatherings and business purposes. Hospitality was very important at this

time and the family entertained many guests.

In most cases paperwork from medieval families has not survived, but in Alice's case it has. Documents are kept in the British Library and, surprisingly, at the University of Chicago. Among them is a household book that records expenditure for Acton Hall. It was probably kept by a literate and numerate member of the house or by a priest who was in attendance. The book gives a good insight into the food that was served. Fish was consumed in abundance, much of it smoked or salted to preserve it.

A prodigious quantity of bread was eaten, corn being ground in the windmill on the estate. Grit from the millstones frequently got into the flour and caused numerous digestive problems. Two types of loaves were made: white and black. The white bread would have been more like our brown bread while the black consisted of sweepings from the granary floor. Meat was eaten but supplies tended to run short in the Autumn and Winter. Shortages were supplemented by pigeons and doves. There is no mention of venison being on the menu - it was illegal to kill deer. Vegetables and fruit were rarely used except for soup or stock. There

being no sugar, honey was used for sweetening.

Alice was a very devout lady, making generous donations to monastic orders. At her death she left money for chants to be sung in church to ease the passage of her soul through purgatory. There is a brass commemorating her on the floor of Acton church.

ur club met on 22 May 2024 at the very modern club house of Colchester Rugby Club, it was well attended with a good mix of ladies and gentlemen

Our guest speaker, Roy Treloar, gave an enlightened talk describing how Cockney Slang originated and prevailed in the city of London over many decades. This unique descriptive mode of speech is believed to have grown steadily in everyday parlance from around 1362. Although the slang does keep pace with the changing times, these days it seems to

be in the process of being replaced by 'Estuary' English.

The well known spectacle of the Pearly Kings and Queens played a large part in popularising the use of this slang over the decades. To celebrate this we were treated to a transformation in Roy, who early in his talk donned a beautiful dark jacket with many 'pearly' decorations and a jaunty, matching cap to accentuate the subject of his talk. Furthermore, it transpires that Cockneys were not always considered the most upstanding members of society but, over the years, have become famous as the colourful characters



they are, representing the London boroughs, and are viewed with great affection for their traditions and particularly their innate humour which was evident in our Speaker – a cockney himself!

We have all become familiar with Cockney Rhyming Slang in our lifetime, being so close to London, and particularly because many Londoners have moved from the smoke to our green pastures and beaches and spread this mode of speech. Roy gave us many examples of where we use them in descriptive speech but the interest was in the detail: the fact that single, double and triple versions of the slang are used and combined. Some people missed this opportunity since bomb damage during the war resulted in the Bow Bells being silenced from 1941 to 1961. They missed using enlightening description phrases such as: Trouble and Strife (wife), Butcher's hook (look), Barnet fair (hair) can become 'a double' linked to an Alf Garnet), Pie and mash (cash) and many, many more that most of us recognise.





e at the Mindful Life Group are delighted to have now received funding from NHS East and West Suffolk Clinical commissioning Groups and Suffolk Community Foundation to provide free online mindfulness courses to support older adults aged 65 and over and carers and former carers living in Suffolk.

Background and information on the course:

The Mindful Life Group is offering an online mindfulness course that is fully funded to support older adults (over 65) in Suffolk. The course is led by a clinical psychologist who is also a mindfulness teacher. The course is based on the mindfulness-based stress reduction course developed by John Kabat Zin but has been adapted for these populations.



We have had really good feedback from participants, and we have found that it improves peoples' attention and memory, as well as reducing loneliness, low mood, stress, anxiety and chronic pain. Many participants have found it simply helps them deal with day-to-day stresses.

We currently have one course running every Thursday from 6th June for six weeks between 1-3pm.

Places are free but limited to around 15.


